## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the offense of fraudulent use or possession of a

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 32.51(a)(1), Penal Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (1) "Identifying information" means information that
- 8 alone or in conjunction with other information identifies an
- 9 individual or a deceased natural person, including an individual's
- 10 or a deceased natural person's:
- 11 (A) name and  $[\tau]$  social security number, date of
- 12 birth, or [and] government-issued identification number;
- 13 (B) unique biometric data, including the
- 14 individual's fingerprint, voice print, or [and] retina or iris
- 15 image;
- 16 (C) unique electronic identification number,
- 17 address, [and] routing code, or financial institution account
- 18 number; and
- 19 (D) telecommunication identifying information or
- 20 access device.
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 32.51(b), Penal Code, is amended to read
- 22 as follows:
- 23 (b) A person commits an offense if the person, with the
- 24 intent to harm or defraud another, obtains, possesses, transfers,

- 1 or uses identifying information of  $\underline{\cdot}$
- 2 (1) a deceased natural person, including a stillborn
- 3 <u>infant or fetus, without legal authorization; or</u>
- 4 (2) another person without the other person's consent
- 5 [and with intent to harm or defraud another].
- 6 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 7 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 8 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 9 covered by the law in effect at the time the offense was committed,
- 10 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 11 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 12 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense was
- 13 committed before that date.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
