4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 204, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 204.2045 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 204.2045. SERVICES PERFORMED DURING DISASTER. (a)
8	The supervision and delegation requirements of this chapter and
9	Subtitle B do not apply to medical tasks performed by a physician
10	assistant during a disaster under the state emergency management
11	plan adopted under Section 418.042, Government Code, or a disaster
12	declared by the governor or United States government. This section
13	does not apply to medical tasks performed by a physician assistant
14	for compensation or other remuneration.
15	(b) A physician assistant performing medical tasks under
16	this section is entitled to the immunity from liability provided by
17	Section 74.151, Civil Practice and Remedies Code.
18	(c) A physician assistant may perform tasks described by
19	this section:
20	(1) under the supervision of any physician who is also
21	performing volunteer work in the disaster; or
22	(2) without the supervision of a physician, if a
23	physician is not available to provide supervision.
24	(d) A physician assistant employed by the United States

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1	government or licensed in another state may perform medical tasks
2	in this state in circumstances described by Subsection (a) without
3	holding a license in this state.
4	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
5	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
6	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
7	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

8 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
