- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 771, Health and Safety
- 6 Code, is amended by adding Section 771.0745 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 771.0745. TEMPORARY EXEMPTION FOR CERTAIN WIRELESS
- 8 CONNECTIONS. (a) In this section, "prepaid wireless
- 9 telecommunications connection" means a wireless telecommunications
- 10 connection that:
- 11 (1) is activated in advance either by payment of a
- finite dollar amount or for a finite set of minutes; and
- (2) terminates automatically with use or over time,
- 14 unless an additional finite dollar amount is paid or finite set of
- 15 minutes is purchased.
- 16 (b) A fee or surcharge authorized by this subchapter,
- 17 Chapter 772, or a home-rule municipality may not be imposed on or
- 18 collected from a wireless service provider for a prepaid wireless
- 19 <u>telecommunications connection.</u>
- 20 <u>(c) This section expires September 1, 2007.</u>
- 21 SECTION 2. (a) The House Committee on Regulated Industries
- 22 shall conduct an interim study regarding the imposition of
- 23 emergency services fees and surcharges on certain wireless
- 24 telecommunications connections as provided by this section.

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- 1 (b) The lieutenant governor may designate a senate
- 2 committee to jointly conduct the study with the House Committee on
- 3 Regulated Industries.
- 4 (c) The committee shall investigate:
- 5 (1) methods for charging emergency service fees and
- 6 surcharges on prepaid wireless telecommunications connections and
- 7 other new telecommunications connections that are not charged an
- 8 emergency service fee; and
- 9 (2) the manner in which providers of those
- 10 telecommunications connections may collect emergency service fees
- 11 or surcharges from consumers.
- 12 (d) Not later than September 1, 2006, the committee shall
- 13 submit the results of the study and a proposal for legislation to
- 14 address issues identified by the study to the lieutenant governor,
- 15 the speaker of the house of representatives, and the members of the
- 16 legislature.
- 17 (e) This section expires October 1, 2006.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
