A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the regulation of neighborhood electric vehicles and
- 3 motor assisted scooters.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 551.303, Transportation Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 551.303. OPERATION ON ROADWAYS OR SIDEWALKS. (a) A
- 8 neighborhood electric vehicle or motor assisted scooter may be
- 9 operated only on a street or highway for which the posted speed
- 10 limit is 35 miles per hour or less. The [A neighborhood electric]
- 11 vehicle may cross a road or street at an intersection where the road
- or street has a posted speed limit of more than 35 miles per hour.
- 13 (b) A county or municipality may prohibit the operation of a
- 14 neighborhood electric vehicle or motor assisted scooter on a
- 15 street, [ex] highway, or sidewalk if the governing body of the
- 16 county or municipality determines that the prohibition is necessary
- in the interest of safety.
- 18 (c) The <u>department</u> [Texas Department of Transportation] may
- 19 prohibit the operation of a neighborhood electric vehicle or motor
- 20 <u>assisted scooter</u> on a highway if <u>it</u> [that department] determines
- 21 that the prohibition is necessary in the interest of safety.
- 22 (d) A person may operate a motor assisted scooter on a path
- 23 set aside for the exclusive operation of bicycles or on a sidewalk.
- 24 Except as otherwise provided by this section, a provision of this

- 1 title applicable to the operation of a bicycle applies to the
- 2 operation of a motor assisted scooter.
- 3 (e) A provision of this title applicable to a motor vehicle
- 4 does not apply to a motor assisted scooter.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 551.302, Transportation Code, as added
- 6 by Chapter 1325, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session,
- 7 2003, is repealed.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
