A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the period in which a birth certificate must be filed or 3 a birth reported.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 192.003, Health and Safety Code, is 6 amended by amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (e) to 7 read as follows:

8 (d) <u>Except as provided by Subsection (e), a</u> [A] person 9 required to file a birth certificate or report a birth shall file 10 the certificate or make the report not later than the fifth day 11 after the date of the birth.

12 (e) Based on a parent's religious beliefs, a parent may 13 request that a person required to file a birth certificate or report 14 a birth delay filing the certificate or making the report until the parent contacts the person with the child's name. If a parent does 15 16 not name the child before the fifth day after the date of the birth due to the parent's religious beliefs, the parent must contact the 17 18 person required to file the birth certificate or report the birth with the name of the child as soon as the child is named. A person 19 required to file the birth certificate or report the birth who 20 21 delays filing the certificate or making the report in accordance with the parent's request shall file the certificate or make the 22 23 report not later than the 15th day after the date of the child's

1 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 3 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 4 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 5 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the 6 legislative session.
