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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to promotion of students to certain grade levels in public 3 school. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 28.0211, Education Code, is amended by 5 6 amending Subsections (a) and (c)-(f) and adding Subsections (a-1), 7 (b-1), and (d-1) to read as follows: (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b-1), (d), [(b)] or 8 9 (e), a student may not be promoted to: (1) the fourth grade program to which the student 10 would otherwise be assigned if the student does not perform 11 satisfactorily on the third grade reading assessment instrument 12 under Section 39.023; 13 14 (2) the sixth grade program to which the student would assigned if the student does otherwise 15 be not perform satisfactorily on the fifth grade mathematics and 16 reading assessment instruments under Section 39.023; or 17 18 (3) the ninth grade program to which the student would otherwise be assigned if the student does not 19 perform satisfactorily on the eighth grade mathematics and reading 20 21 assessment instruments under Section 39.023. 22 (a-1) A school district shall establish a grade placement 23 committee to determine whether to promote or retain a student who fails to perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument 24

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1	specified under Subsection (a). The grade placement committee
2	shall be composed of the student's principal or the principal's
3	designee, the teacher of the subject of an assessment instrument on
4	which the student failed to perform satisfactorily, and a counselor
5	at the student's school, or in the student's school district if the
6	student's school does not have a counselor. The district shall
7	notify the student's parent or guardian of:
8	(1) the student's failure to perform satisfactorily on
9	the assessment instrument;
10	(2) the time and place for convening the grade
11	placement committee and the purpose of the committee; and
12	(3) the possibility that the student might be retained
13	at the same grade level for the next school year.
14	(b-1) The grade placement committee may decide to promote a
15	student who fails to perform satisfactorily on an assessment
16	instrument specified under Subsection (a) if the committee
17	concludes, using standards adopted by the board of trustees, that
18	if promoted and given accelerated instruction as provided by
19	Subsection (f), the student is likely to perform at grade level.
20	The standards adopted by the board of trustees may include:
21	(1) evidence of satisfactory student performance,
22	including grades, portfolios, work samples, local assessments, and
23	individual reading and mathematics diagnostic tests or
24	inventories;
25	(2) grades in language arts, mathematics, science, and
26	social studies for the grade level from which the student seeks
27	promotion;

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1	(3) performance on the individual assessment
2	instruments administered to the student under Section 39.023;
3	(4) total scores on the assessment instrument or
4	instruments specified by Subsection (a); and
5	(5) extenuating circumstances that have adversely
6	affected the student's participation in the required assessments.
7	(c) If the grade placement committee decides not to promote
8	a student under Subsection (b-1), the [Each time a student fails to
9	perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument specified under
10	Subsection (a), the school district in which the student attends
11	school shall provide to the student accelerated instruction in the
12	applicable subject area, including reading instruction for a
13	student who fails to perform satisfactorily on a reading assessment
14	instrument. After a student fails to perform satisfactorily on an
15	assessment instrument a second time, a] grade placement committee
16	shall [ <del>be established to</del> ] prescribe [ <del>the</del> ] accelerated instruction
17	for [the district shall provide to] the student for the remainder of
18	the school year and may prescribe accelerated instruction for the
19	time school is recessed for the summer [before the student is
20	administered the assessment instrument the third time]. [The grade
21	placement committee shall be composed of the principal or the
22	principal's designee, the student's parent or guardian, and the
23	teacher of the subject of an assessment instrument on which the
24	student failed to perform satisfactorily. The district shall
25	notify the parent or guardian of the time and place for convening
26	the grade placement committee and the purpose of the committee.] An
27	accelerated instruction group administered by a school district

1	under this section may not have a ratio of more than 10 students for
2	each teacher. The accelerated instruction must include reading
3	instruction for a student who fails to perform satisfactorily on a
4	reading assessment instrument. The
5	[ <del>(d) In addition to providing accelerated instruction to a</del>
6	student under Subsection (c), the] district shall notify the
7	student's parent or guardian of[+
8	[ <del>(1) the student's failure to perform satisfactorily</del>
9	on the assessment instrument;
10	[ <del>(2)</del> ] the accelerated instruction program to which the
11	student is assigned[ <del>; and</del>
12	[ <del>(3) the possibility that the student might be</del>
13	retained at the same grade level for the next school year].
14	(d) The grade placement committee may decide in favor of a
15	student's promotion after a student has received accelerated
16	instruction as provided by Subsection (c) if the committee
17	concludes, using the same standards adopted by the board of
18	trustees under Subsection (b-1), that if promoted and given
19	accelerated instruction as provided by Subsection (f), the student
20	is likely to perform at grade level.
21	(d-1) A student may not be retained on the basis of the grade
22	placement committee's decision unless that decision is unanimous.
23	The commissioner by rule shall establish a time line for making the
24	placement determination.
25	(e) A student who[ <del>, after at least three attempts,</del> ] fails to
26	perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument specified under
27	Subsection (a) and is not promoted by the grade placement committee

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under Subsection (b-1) or (d) shall be retained at the same grade 1 2 level for the next school year in accordance with Subsection (a). 3 The student's parent or guardian may appeal the student's retention submitting a request to the grade placement committee 4 by 5 established under Subsection (a-1) to reconsider its decision under <u>Subsection (d)</u> [(c)]. The school district shall give the parent or 6 7 guardian written notice of the opportunity to appeal. Subsections 8 (b-1) and (d) and this [The grade placement committee may decide in 9 favor of a student's promotion only if the committee concludes, 10 using standards adopted by the board of trustees, that if promoted and given accelerated instruction, the student is likely to perform 11 12 at grade level. A student may not be promoted on the basis of the grade placement committee's decision unless that decision is 13 14 unanimous. The commissioner by rule shall establish a time line for making the placement determination. This] subsection do [does] not 15 create a property interest in promotion. [The decision of the grade 16 17 placement committee is final and may not be appealed.]

A school district shall provide to a student who[, after 18 (f) three attempts, has failed to perform satisfactorily on an 19 assessment instrument specified under Subsection (a) accelerated 20 21 instruction during the next school year as prescribed by an educational plan developed for the student by the student's grade 22 23 placement committee established under Subsection (a-1) [(c)]. The 24 district shall provide that accelerated instruction regardless of whether the student has been promoted or retained. The educational 25 26 plan must be designed to enable the student to perform at the 27 appropriate grade level by the conclusion of the school year.

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During the school year, the student shall be monitored to ensure that the student is progressing in accordance with the plan. The district shall administer to the student the assessment instrument for the grade level in which the student is placed at the time the district regularly administers the assessment instruments for that school year.

SECTION 2. Section 28.0211(b), Education Code, is repealed.
SECTION 3. Section 28.0211, Education Code, as amended by
this Act, applies beginning with the 2005-2006 school year.

10 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
