4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 321.011, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
7	(e) The State Auditor may:
8	(1) employ investigators as the State Auditor
9	considers necessary to implement this chapter; and
10	(2) in accordance with Chapter 1701, Occupations Code,
11	appoint one or more of those investigators as peace officers.
12	SECTION 2. Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, as
13	amended by Chapters 235, 474, and 930, Acts of the 78th Legislature,
14	Regular Session, 2003, is reenacted and amended to read as follows:
15	Art. 2.12. WHO ARE PEACE OFFICERS. The following are peace
16	officers:
17	(1) sheriffs, their deputies, and those reserve
18	deputies who hold a permanent peace officer license issued under
19	Chapter 1701, Occupations Code;
20	(2) constables, deputy constables, and those reserve
21	deputy constables who hold a permanent peace officer license issued
22	under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code;
23	(3) marshals or police officers of an incorporated
24	city, town, or village, and those reserve municipal police officers

who hold a permanent peace officer license issued under Chapter 1 2 1701, Occupations Code; rangers and officers commissioned by the Public 3 (4) 4 Safety Commission and the Director of the Department of Public 5 Safety; investigators of the district attorneys', criminal 6 (5) 7 district attorneys', and county attorneys' offices; 8 (6) law enforcement agents of the Texas Alcoholic 9 Beverage Commission; 10 (7) each member of an arson investigating unit commissioned by a city, a county, or the state; 11 officers 12 (8) commissioned under Section 37.081, Education Code, or Subchapter E, Chapter 51, Education Code; 13 14 (9) officers commissioned by the General Services 15 Commission; (10)law enforcement officers commissioned by the 16 17 Parks and Wildlife Commission; airport police officers commissioned by a city 18 (11)with a population of more than 1.18 million that operates an airport 19 that serves commercial air carriers; 20 21 (12) airport security personnel commissioned as peace officers by the governing body of any political subdivision of this 22 state, other than a city described by Subdivision (11), that 23 24 operates an airport that serves commercial air carriers; 25 (13) municipal park and recreational patrolmen and security officers; 26 security officers and investigators commissioned 27 (14)

14 (20) investigators employed by the Texas Racing 15 Commission;

16 (21) officers commissioned under Chapter 554,

18 (22) officers commissioned by the governing body of a
19 metropolitan rapid transit authority under Section 451.108,
20 Transportation Code, or by a regional transportation authority
21 under Section 452.110, Transportation Code;

(23) investigators commissioned by the attorneygeneral under Section 402.009, Government Code;

24 (24) security officers and investigators commissioned
25 as peace officers under Chapter 466, Government Code;

(25) an officer employed by the Texas Department of
Health under Section 431.2471, Health and Safety Code;

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1 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
