- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subdivision (1), Section 245.001, Local
- 6 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (1) "Permit" means a license, certificate, approval,
- 8 registration, consent, permit, contract or other agreement for the
- 9 construction or provision of utilities, or any other form of
- 10 authorization or condition precedent required by law, rule,
- 11 regulation, order, or ordinance that a person must obtain to
- 12 perform an action or initiate, continue, or complete a project for
- 13 which the permit is sought.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 245.002, Local Government Code, is
- amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1), to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 (a) Each regulatory agency shall consider the approval,
- 18 disapproval, or conditional approval of an application for a permit
- 19 solely on the basis of any orders, regulations, ordinances, rules,
- 20 expiration dates, or other properly adopted requirements in effect
- 21 at the time:
- (1) the original application for the permit is filed
- 23 for review for any purpose, including review for administrative
- 24 completeness; or

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1 (2) a plan for development of real property is filed 2 with a regulatory agency.

(a-1) Rights to which a permit applicant is entitled under this chapter accrue on filing of an original application or plan of development that gives the regulatory agency fair notice of the project and the nature of the permit sought. An application or plan is considered filed on the date the applicant delivers the application or plan to the regulatory agency or deposits the application or plan with the United States Postal Service by certified mail addressed to the regulatory agency. A certified mail receipt obtained by the applicant at the time of deposit is prima facie evidence of the date the application or plan was deposited with the United States Postal Service.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
