5	SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 3, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 112 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 112. REDUCED LICENSING REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN HEALTH
8	CARE PRACTITIONERS
9	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
10	Sec. 112.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
11	(1) "Health care practitioner" means an individual
12	issued a license, certificate, registration, title, permit, or
13	other authorization to engage in a health care profession.
14	(2) "Licensing entity" means a department,
15	commission, board, office, authority, or other agency of the state
16	that regulates activities and persons under this title.
17	Sec. 112.002. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies only to
18	licensing entities and health care practitioners under Subtitles
19	B-K and M.

21	SUBCHAPTER B. HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONERS FROM FOREIGN JURISDICTIONS
22	Sec. 112.051. REDUCED LICENSE REQUIREMENTS FOR HEALTH CARE
23	PRACTITIONERS FROM FOREIGN JURISDICTIONS. (a) Each licensing
24	entity shall adopt rules providing for reduced licensing

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1	requirements for a health care practitioner licensed in good
2	standing in a foreign jurisdiction.
3	(b) The rules adopted under this section must allow the
4	health care practitioner to be issued a license after taking
5	intensive and expedited courses at institutions of higher education
6	in this state. In addition to courses provided by institutions of
7	higher education, the rules may require that the health care
8	practitioner complete additional continuing education courses
9	before being issued a license.

10 SECTION 2. (a) In this section, "health care practitioner" 11 and "licensing entity" have the meanings assigned by Section 12 112.001, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.

(b) Each licensing entity required to adopt rules under Section 112.051, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, shall analyze the heath care needs of geographical areas of this state that lack qualified health care practitioners of the type regulated by that licensing entity. The analysis shall focus on nonurban areas.

19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
