A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of certain nursing practices. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subchapter H, Chapter 301, Occupations Code, is 4 5 amended by adding Section 301.353 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 301.353. NURSE FIRST ASSISTANTS; ASSISTING AT SURGERY BY OTHER NURSES. (a) In this section, "nurse first assistant" 7 means a registered nurse who: 8 (1) has completed a nurse first assistant educational 9 program approved or recognized by an organization recognized by the 10 11 board; and 12 (2) is either: 13 (A) certified in perioperative nursing by an 14 organization recognized by the board; or (B) recognized by the board as an advanced 15 practice nurse and qualified by education, training, or experience 16 to perform the tasks involved in perioperative nursing. 17 18 (b) Unless the person is a nurse first assistant, the person 19 may not use: (1) the title "nurse first assistant" or "registered 20 21 nurse first assistant"; 22 (2) the abbreviation "R.N.F.A."; or 23 (3) any other title or abbreviation that implies to 24 the public that the person is qualified as a nurse first assistant

2	(c) A health maintenance organization or an insurer,
3	including an insurer offering a preferred provider benefit plan,
4	may not, by contract or any other method, require a physician to use
5	the services of a nurse first assistant.
6	(d) A nurse who is not a nurse first assistant may assist a
7	physician, podiatrist, or dentist in the performance of surgery if
8	the nurse:
9	(1) assists under the direct personal supervision and
10	in the physical presence of the physician, podiatrist, or dentist;
11	(2) is in the same sterile field as the physician,
12	podiatrist, or dentist;
13	(3) is employed by:
14	(A) the physician, podiatrist, or dentist;
15	(B) a group to which the physician, podiatrist,
16	or dentist belongs; or
17	(C) a hospital licensed or owned by the state;
18	and
19	(4) is qualified by education, training, or experience
20	to perform the tasks assigned to the nurse.
21	(e) A patient or third-party insurer may not be billed
22	separately for the services performed by a nurse described by
23	Subsection (d).
24	SECTION 2. Sections 301.1525, 301.1526, and 301.1527,
25	Occupations Code, are repealed.
26	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
