A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the creation of and funding for the Texas
- 3 Entrepreneurship Network.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subtitle F, Title 4, Government Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Chapter 490 to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 490. TEXAS ENTREPRENEURSHIP NETWORK
- 8 Sec. 490.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 9 (1) "Entrepreneur participant" means an individual
- 10 who has a business or an idea for a business and registers with the
- 11 network.
- 12 (2) "Fund" means the Texas Entrepreneurship Network
- 13 fund.
- 14 (3) "Network" means the Texas Entrepreneurship
- 15 Network.
- Sec. 490.002. ESTABLISHMENT OF NETWORK. (a) The Texas
- 17 Entrepreneurship Network is established to develop and diversify
- 18 the economy of this state through:
- 19 (1) the provision of programs and services to
- 20 facilitate the growth and success of entrepreneurs; and
- 21 (2) the statewide, results-driven collaboration of
- 22 public and private entities to create jobs and energize sustainable
- 23 local economies through the development of entrepreneurs in this
- 24 state.

1	(b) The Texas Center for Rural Entrepreneurship shall:
2	(1) operate the network under an agreement with the
3	Department of Agriculture and as provided by this chapter; and
4	(2) comply with all reasonable and customary oversight
5	measures required by the Department of Agriculture.
6	Sec. 490.003. MEMBERS OF NETWORK. (a) The founding members
7	of the network are:
8	(1) the Texas Cooperative Extension of The Texas A&M
9	University System;
10	(2) the IC2 Institute at The University of Texas at
11	Austin;
12	(3) the College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural
13	Resources at Texas Tech University;
14	(4) the Department of Agriculture;
15	(5) the Texas Workforce Commission;
16	(6) the Office of Rural Community Affairs;
17	(7) the Texas Center for Rural Entrepreneurship; and
18	(8) the Texas Economic Development Council.
19	(b) An institution of higher education, chamber of
20	commerce, economic development corporation, business, or
21	organization with an interest in promoting entrepreneurship may
22	join the network.
23	Sec. 490.004. ADVISORY BOARD. (a) The Texas Center for
24	Rural Entrepreneurship shall establish an advisory board to guide
25	and advise the operations of the network.
26	(b) The advisory board consists of one representative from
27	each of the founding members of the network under Section

- 1 490.003(a), and at least one member from the private sector. An
- 2 organization other than a founding member of the network under
- 3 Section 490.003(a) may have a representative on the advisory board
- 4 only if the creation of an additional seat on the board is
- 5 authorized by a two-thirds majority vote of the existing board.
- 6 (c) The initial advisory board shall adopt provisions to
- 7 determine the terms of board members and stagger the members'
- 8 terms, and other provisions necessary to administer the board.
- 9 <u>(d) Advisory board members serve without compensation but</u>
- 10 are entitled to reimbursement for reasonable expenses incurred in
- 11 traveling to meetings related to the network.
- 12 Sec. 490.005. GENERAL DUTIES AND GOALS. (a) The network
- 13 shall train and refocus existing state and local resources to build
- 14 a more prosperous, dynamic, and sustainable economy throughout this
- 15 state by:
- 16 (1) providing coordinated training and services that
- 17 enhance the value of the state's existing infrastructure
- 18 investments and make the investments available to entrepreneur
- 19 participants;
- 20 (2) developing a statewide network of
- 21 <u>entrepreneurship developers and entrepreneurship centers as</u>
- 22 provided by Section 490.006;
- 23 (3) developing a comprehensive network of knowledge,
- leadership, and financial capital resources accessible through the
- 25 <u>network's entrepreneurship developers and entrepreneurship</u>
- 26 centers;
- 27 (4) educating entrepreneur participants and

- 1 generating awareness of the network and its programs;
- 2 (5) identifying the most promising ventures through
- 3 activities, including business-plan competitions, and assisting
- 4 the ventures' potential for job and wealth creation;
- 5 (6) developing evaluation methods to measure the
- 6 effectiveness of the network and the impact of entrepreneurship on
- 7 local and regional economies;
- 8 (7) developing best practices for successful
- 9 entrepreneurship and applied research regarding critical success
- 10 factors for entrepreneurial businesses to provide a strategic
- 11 competitive advantage for businesses in this state; and
- 12 (8) collaborating with existing local, state, and
- 13 federal agencies and economic development professionals to use the
- 14 strengths and assets of the agencies and professionals.
- 15 (b) The network shall work locally, regionally, and
- 16 statewide with educators, agencies, organizations, networks,
- 17 businesses, economic developers, consultants, communities,
- 18 researchers, or other persons to develop and support strategies to
- 19 assist entrepreneur participants and improve the environment for
- 20 entrepreneurial development in this state.
- 21 Sec. 490.006. ENTREPRENEURSHIP SERVICES. (a) The network
- 22 shall develop a statewide association of local individuals who are
- 23 entrepreneurship developers trained to analyze, evaluate, and
- 24 develop business plans and help local entrepreneur participants
- 25 start, grow, or develop their businesses.
- 26 (b) The network may establish local entrepreneurship
- 27 centers in every county practicable, at which an entrepreneur

1 participant may access programs, necessary support, and online 2 resources provided and developed by the network. In establishing the entrepreneurship centers, the network shall use existing 3 4 infrastructure, public and private organizations, and other resources, including chambers of commerce, universities and 5 6 community colleges, county extension offices, Texas Workforce Commission offices, and local business offices. 7 (c) The network shall adopt requirements 8 entrepreneurship centers. An organization must meet 9 the requirements adopted under this subsection before hosting an 10 11 entrepreneurship center. (d) A group of individuals who have services, resources, or 12 expertise to offer entrepreneur participants may agree to provide 13 14 services through the network as an entrepreneurship force. Sec. 490.007. NETWORK PROGRAMS. The network may develop: 15 (1) programs for: 16 17 (A) business plan development, competitive enhancement, and management skills development; 18 19 (B) entrepreneurship best practices training; 20 (C) entrepreneurship education in primary and 21 secondary schools and community colleges; 22 (D) expanding entrepreneurship in workforce 23 development programs; 24 (E) accessing sources of start-up and growth 25 capital;

(F) training and assisting entrepreneurship

2	evaluation, and community planning;
3	(2) methods for helping entrepreneur participants
4	access other loan, guarantee, and grant programs;
5	(3) necessary policies and regulations; and
6	(4) collaborations with other entities.
7	Sec. 490.008. TEXAS ENTREPRENEURSHIP NETWORK FUND. (a)
8	The Texas Entrepreneurship Network fund is an account in the
9	general revenue fund. The Department of Agriculture shall
10	administer the fund.
11	(b) The following amounts shall be deposited in the fund:
12	(1) any amounts appropriated by the legislature for
13	the fund; and
14	(2) gifts, grants, and other donations received for
15	the fund.
16	(c) The fund may be used only for network purposes, subject
17	to Section 490.009.
18	(d) The network may solicit and accept gifts and grants for
19	the fund from public and private universities and all other public
20	and private entities.
21	Sec. 490.009. USE OF FUND. Money appropriated to the fund
22	by the legislature shall be used for:
23	(1) programs related to local entrepreneurship
24	centers, training, and entrepreneurship developers;
25	(2) curriculum development, infrastructure, data
26	management, and research;
27	(3) technology and economic development research

- 1 centers of excellence;
- 2 (4) the network's overhead expenses; and
- 3 (5) other activities necessary to accomplish the
- 4 mission of this chapter.
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
