A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the admissions policies of charter schools. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Chapter 12, Education Code, is amended by 4 5 renumbering the subsequent subsections appropriately, and adding a 6 new Subsection (b) to Section 12.117 to read as follows: (b) The following categories of students are exempted from 7 the lottery described in Subsection (a)(2)(A): 8 (1) children and grandchildren of the founders of the 9 open-enrollment charter school, 10 11 (2) children of employees of the charter school and 12 the charter holder (3) siblings of students enrolled in the school 13 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 12, Education Code, is amended by adding a new subsection renumbered appropriately to Section 12.117, as 15 follows: 16 Total enrollment shall not exceed the maximum number 17 of students approved in the open-enrollment charter. 18 Students who reside outside the geographic boundaries 19 stated in the open-enrollment charter shall not be 20 21 admitted to the charter school until all eligible applicants who reside within the boundaries and have 22 23 submitted a timely application have been enrolled. Then, if the open-enrollment charter so provides, the 24

1charter holder may admit transfer students to the2charter school in accordance with the terms of the3open-enrollment charter.

SECTION 3. This Act validates and confirms in all respects the admission of any students described in this Act to any open-enrollment charter school prior to the effective date of this Act. This Act does not validate any official act or proceeding that, under the law of this state at the time the act or proceeding occurred, was a misdemeanor or a felony.

10 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect 11 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members 12 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas 13 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for 14 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
