- 4 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 42.091, Penal Code, is 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 42.091. ASSAULT [ATTACK] ON ASSISTANCE ANIMAL.
- SECTION 2. Sections 42.091(a)-(c), Penal Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 9 (a) A person commits an offense if the person intentionally,
 10 knowingly, or recklessly [attacks,] injures[,] or kills an
 11 assistance animal belonging to another without legal authority or
- 12 <u>the owner's consent</u>.
- 13 (b) A person commits an offense if the person intentionally,
- 14 knowingly, or recklessly incites or permits an animal owned by or
- otherwise in the custody of the actor to $[attack_{\tau}]$ injure $[\tau]$ or kill
- an assistance animal belonging to another without legal authority
- 17 or the owner's consent [and, as a result of the person's conduct,
- 18 the assistance animal is attacked, injured, or killed].
- 19 (c) An offense under this section is a:
- 20 (1) [Class A misdemeanor if the actor or an animal
- 21 owned by or otherwise in the custody of the actor attacks an
- 22 assistance animal;
- 23 $\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$ state jail felony if the actor or an animal owned
- 24 by or otherwise in the custody of the actor injures an assistance

- (2) (3) felony of the third degree if the actor or an

- 5 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 6 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 7 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 8 covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the
- 9 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of
- 10 this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of
- 11 this Act if any element of the offense was committed before that
- 12 date.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
