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- 2 relating to historical reenactments on premises permitted or 3 licensed under the Alcoholic Beverage Code.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 11.61, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 6 amended by amending Subsection (e) and adding Subsection (i) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (e) Except as provided by Subsection (f) or (i), the
- 9 commission or administrator shall cancel an original or renewal
- 10 permit if it is found, after notice and hearing, that the permittee
- 11 knowingly allowed a person to possess a firearm in a building on the
- 12 licensed premises. This subsection does not apply to a person:
- 13 (1) who holds a security officer commission issued
- under Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, if:
- 15 (A) the person is engaged in the performance of
- 16 the person's duties as a security officer;
- 17 (B) the person is wearing a distinctive uniform;
- 18 and
- 19 (C) the weapon is in plain view;
- 20 (2) who is a peace officer;
- 21 (3) who is a permittee or an employee of a permittee if
- the person is supervising the operation of the premises; or
- 23 (4) who possesses a concealed handgun of the same
- 24 category the person is licensed to carry under Subchapter H,

- 1 Chapter 411, Government Code, unless the person is on the premises
- of a business described by Section 46.035(b)(1), Penal Code.
- 3 (i) The commission shall adopt rules allowing a historical
- 4 reenactment on the premises of a permit holder.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 61.71, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 6 amended by amending Subsection (f) and adding Subsection (j) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (f) Except as provided by Subsection (g) or (j), the
- 9 commission or administrator shall cancel an original or renewal
- 10 dealer's on-premises or off-premises license if it is found, after
- 11 notice and hearing, that the licensee knowingly allowed a person to
- 12 possess a firearm in a building on the licensed premises. This
- 13 subsection does not apply to a person:
- 14 (1) who holds a security officer commission issued
- under Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, if:
- 16 (A) the person is engaged in the performance of
- 17 the person's duties as a security officer;
- 18 (B) the person is wearing a distinctive uniform;
- 19 and
- 20 (C) the weapon is in plain view;
- 21 (2) who is a peace officer;
- 22 (3) who is a licensee or an employee of a licensee if
- 23 the person is supervising the operation of the premises; or
- 24 (4) who possesses a concealed handgun of the same
- 25 category the person is licensed to carry under Subchapter H,
- 26 Chapter 411, Government Code, unless the person is on the premises
- of a business described by Section 46.035(b)(1), Penal Code.

- 1 (j) The commission shall adopt rules allowing a historical
- 2 reenactment on the premises of a license holder.
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 46.035, Penal Code, is amended by adding
- 4 Subsection (j) to read as follows:
- 5 (j) Subsections (a) and (b)(1) do not apply to a historical
- 6 reenactment performed in compliance with the rules of the Texas
- 7 <u>Alcoholic Beverage Commission.</u>
- 8 SECTION 4. Section 46.15, Penal Code, is amended by adding
- 9 Subsection (i) to read as follows:
- 10 (i) The provisions of Section 46.02 prohibiting the
- 11 carrying of a handgun do not apply to an individual who carries a
- 12 handgun as a participant in a historical reenactment performed in
- 13 accordance with the rules of the Texas Alcoholic Beverage
- 14 Commission.
- 15 SECTION 5. (a) The Alcoholic Beverage Commission shall
- 16 adopt rules under Sections 11.61(i) and 61.71(j), Alcoholic
- 17 Beverage Code, as added by this Act, not later than January 1, 2006.
- (b) The change in law made by Sections 3 and 4 of this Act
- 19 applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective date
- of this Act. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed
- 21 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense
- occurs before that date. An offense committed before the effective
- date of this Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was
- 24 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 25 purpose.
- 26 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
