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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT relating to the licensing and regulation of massage therapists; 2 3 providing a penalty. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Sections 455.001(1), (2), (3), (6), (7), and 5 (9), Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 7 (1) ["Board" means the Texas Board of Health. 8 [(2)] "Department" means the [Texas] Department of State Health Services. 9 (2) "Executive commissioner" means the executive 10 11 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission. 12 (3) "Instructor" means a person who instructs a student in any section of the course of instruction required for 13 14 issuance of [registration as] a massage therapist license. (6) "Massage school" means an entity that: 15 (A) teaches at a minimum the course 16 of instruction required for <u>issuance of</u> [registration as] a massage 17 therapist license; and 18 (B) has at least two instructors. 19 "Massage therapist" means a person who practices 20 (7)21 or administers massage therapy to a client for compensation. The 22 includes a licensed [registered] massage therapist, term therapeutic massage practitioner, massage technician, masseur, 23 masseuse, myotherapist, body massager, body rubber, or 24 any

1 derivation of those titles.

2 (9) "Massage therapy instructor" means a <u>licensed</u>
3 [registered] massage therapist who provides to one or more students
4 instruction approved by the department in massage therapy.

5 SECTION 2. Sections 455.003 and 455.004, Occupations Code, 6 are amended to read as follows:

Sec. 455.003. PRACTICES INCLUDED IN MASSAGE THERAPY. Massage therapy includes <u>the application of hydrotherapy or</u> <u>temperature for mechanical, thermal, or chemical effect and may</u> <u>include</u> the use of oil, salt glows, heat lamps, hot and cold packs, and tub, shower, or cabinet baths.

Sec. 455.004. APPLICABILITY OF CHAPTER. This chapter does not apply to:

(1) a person licensed in this state as a physician,
chiropractor, <u>occupational therapist</u>, physical therapist, nurse,
cosmetologist, or athletic trainer or as a member of a similar
profession subject to state licensing while the person is

Sec. 455.056. RULES REGARDING ADVERTISING OR COMPETITIVE BIDDING [BY REGISTRANT]. (a) The <u>executive commissioner</u> [board] may not adopt rules restricting advertising or competitive bidding by a person <u>licensed</u> [registered] under this chapter except to prohibit false, misleading, or deceptive practices.

(b) In [its] rules to prohibit false, misleading, or deceptive practices, the <u>executive commissioner</u> [board] may not include a rule that:

(1) restricts the use of any medium for advertising;
 (2) restricts the use of a <u>licensed</u> [registered]
 person's personal appearance or voice in an advertisement;

(3) relates to the size or duration of an
 advertisement by the <u>licensed</u> [registered] person; or

3 (4) restricts the <u>licensed</u> [registered] person's
4 advertisement under a trade name.

5 Sec. 455.057. CONTINUING EDUCATION. The <u>department</u> 6 [board] shall recognize, prepare, or administer continuing 7 education programs for persons <u>licensed</u> [registered] under this 8 chapter. A <u>licensed</u> [registered] person must participate in the 9 programs to the extent required by the <u>department</u> [board] to keep 10 the person's <u>license</u> [certificate of registration].

SECTION 7. Section 455.104, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

7 (b) Unless the person is exempt from the <u>licensing</u> 8 [registration] requirement, a person may not represent that the 9 person is a massage therapist unless the person holds a <u>license</u> 10 [certificate of registration] under this chapter.

11 Sec. 455.152. INELIGIBILITY FOR <u>LICENSE</u> [REGISTRATION]. 12 (a) A person is not eligible for <u>a license</u> [registration] as a 13 massage establishment, massage school, massage therapist, or 14 massage therapy instructor if the person is an individual and has 15 been convicted of, entered a plea of nolo contendere or guilty to, 16 or received deferred adjudication for an offense involving 17 prostitution or another sexual offense.

(b) A person convicted of a violation of this chapter is
ineligible for <u>a license</u> [registration] as a massage establishment,
massage school, massage therapist, or massage therapy instructor
until the fifth anniversary of the date of the conviction.

22 SECTION 10. Sections 455.153-455.156, Occupations Code, 23 are amended to read as follows:

24 Sec. 455.153. APPLICATION FOR <u>LICENSE</u> [REGISTRATION]. An 25 applicant for <u>a license</u> [registration] under this chapter must:

26 (1) submit an application form provided by the 27 department; [and]

6 Sec. 455.154. GENERAL PROVISIONS RELATING TO <u>LICENSES</u> 7 [RECISTRATION]. (a) The holder of a <u>license</u> [certificate of 8 registration] may exercise all professional rights, honors, and 9 privileges relating to the practice of massage therapy.

10 (b) A <u>license</u> [certificate of registration] is the property 11 of the department and must be surrendered on demand.

12Sec. 455.155.LICENSE[REGISTRATION]EXEMPTION[FOR13MASSAGE ESTABLISHMENT].(a)Section 455.151 does not apply to an14establishment that:

(1) holds a license, permit, certificate, or othercredential issued by this state under another law; and

17 (2) offers or performs massage therapy under the scope18 of that credential.

(b) A <u>licensed</u> [registered] massage therapist who practices
as a solo practitioner is not required to <u>hold a license</u> [register]
as a massage establishment.

(c) The <u>executive commissioner</u> [board] by rule shall provide for a fair and reasonable procedure to grant exemptions from the <u>licensing</u> [registration] requirements of this <u>chapter</u> [section]. The rules must provide that a person is exempt if the person shows that the advertising or provision of massage therapy services is incidental to the person's primary enterprise.

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(d) A sexually oriented business may not:

5 Sec. 455.156. <u>LICENSE</u> [REGISTRATION] REQUIREMENTS FOR 6 MASSAGE THERAPIST. (a) The department shall issue a <u>license</u> 7 [certificate of registration] to each qualified applicant <u>who</u> 8 <u>applies</u> for [registration as] a <u>massage</u> [message] therapist 9 license.

10 (b) An applicant for <u>a license</u> [registration] under this 11 section must be an individual and:

12 (1) present evidence satisfactory to the <u>department</u> 13 [board] that the person:

(A) has satisfactorily completed massage therapy studies in a [300-hour,] supervised course of instruction of at <u>least 500 hours</u> provided by a massage therapy instructor, a <u>licensed</u> [registered] massage school, a state-approved educational institution, or any combination of instructors or schools, in which:

20 (i) <u>at least 200</u> [125] hours are <u>taught by a</u> 21 massage therapy instructor and are dedicated to the study of [Swedish] massage therapy techniques, theory, and practice and 22 manipulation of soft tissue by hand or through the use of a 23 mechanical or electrical apparatus, with at least 75 hours 24 dedicated to Swedish massage techniques, and may include the study 25 26 of Eastern techniques and theory [and taught by a massage therapy instructor]; 27

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1	(ii) <u>at least 165</u> [50] hours are dedicated
2	to the study of anatomy, physiology, and pathology and may include
3	Eastern physiology;
4	(iii) <u>at least</u> [25 hours are dedicated to
5	the study of physiology;
6	[(iv)] 15 hours are dedicated to the study
7	of hydrotherapy;
8	<u>(iv) at least 20</u> [(v) 15] hours are
9	dedicated to the study of business practices;
10	(v) at least 10 hours are dedicated to [and]
11	<pre>professional ethics [standards];</pre>
12	(vi) <u>at least</u> 20 hours are dedicated to the
13	study of health and hygiene; [and]
14	(vii) <u>at least 40</u> [50] hours are spent in
15	hands-on experience in an internship program, provided that the

26	portions of the state] examination; and
27	(3) be at least 18 years of age.

3 (a) Not later than the 30th day after the date a person takes 4 a <u>licensing</u> [registration] examination under this chapter, the 5 department shall notify the person of the results of the 6 examination.

7 (d) If requested in writing by a person who fails a 8 <u>licensing</u> [registration] examination administered under this 9 chapter, the department shall furnish the person with an analysis 10 of the person's performance on the examination.

SECTION 12. Sections 455.1571-455.158, Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:

Sec. 455.1571. APPLICANT <u>LICENSED</u> [REGISTERED] IN ANOTHER 13 14 JURISDICTION. (a) The department [board] may waive any 15 prerequisite to obtaining a <u>license</u> [certificate of registration] for an applicant for licensing [registration] as a massage 16 17 therapist or massage therapy instructor after reviewing the applicant's credentials and determining that the applicant holds a 18 license or certificate of registration issued by 19 another jurisdiction that has licensing or registration requirements 20 21 substantially equivalent to those of this state.

(b) The <u>department</u> [board] may waive any prerequisite to obtaining a <u>license</u> [certificate of registration] for an applicant for <u>licensing</u> [registration] as a massage therapist or massage therapy instructor who holds a license or certificate of registration issued by another jurisdiction with which this state has a reciprocity agreement. The <u>department</u> [board] may make an

agreement, subject to the approval of the governor, with another state to allow for <u>licensing</u> [registration] by reciprocity.

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3 Sec. 455.1572. PROVISIONAL <u>LICENSE</u> [REGISTRATION]. (a) 4 The <u>department</u> [board] may issue a provisional <u>license</u> [certificate 5 <u>of registration</u>] to an applicant for <u>licensing</u> [registration] as a 6 massage therapist or massage therapy instructor currently licensed 7 or registered in another jurisdiction who seeks a <u>license</u> 8 [certificate of registration] in this state and who:

9 (1) has been licensed or registered in good standing 10 as a massage therapist or massage therapy instructor, as 11 applicable, for at least two years in another jurisdiction, 12 including a foreign country, that has licensing or registration 13 requirements substantially equivalent to the requirements of this 14 chapter;

15 (2) has passed a national or other examination 16 recognized by the <u>department</u> [board] relating to the practice of 17 massage therapy; and

(3) is sponsored by a person <u>licensed</u> [registered] by
the <u>department</u> [board] under this chapter with whom the provisional
<u>license holder</u> [registrant] will practice during the time the
person holds a provisional <u>license</u> [certificate of registration].

(b) The <u>department</u> [board] may waive the requirement of
Subsection (a)(3) for an applicant if the <u>department</u> [board]
determines that compliance with that subsection would be a hardship
to the applicant.

26 (c) A provisional <u>license</u> [certificate of registration] is
27 valid until the date the department [board] approves or denies the

<u>provisional license</u> [certificate] holder's application for <u>licensing</u> [registration]. The <u>department</u> [board] shall issue a <u>license</u> [certificate of registration] under this chapter to the provisionally <u>licensed</u> [registered] person if the person:

5 (1) is eligible for a <u>license</u> [certificate of
6 registration] under Section 455.1571; or

7 (2) passes the part of the examination under Section 8 455.101 that relates to the applicant's knowledge and understanding 9 of the laws and rules relating to the practice of massage therapy in 10 this state and:

The <u>department</u> [board] may extend the 20 21 180-day period if the results of an examination have not been received by the department [board] before the end of that period. 22

(e) The <u>department</u> [board] may establish a fee for a provisional <u>license</u> [certificate of registration] in an amount reasonable and necessary to cover the cost of issuing the <u>license</u> [certificate of registration].

27 Sec. 455.158. STUDENT EXEMPTION FROM LICENSING

[RECISTRATION] REQUIREMENTS. A student who provides massage therapy as part of an internship program or without compensation is exempt from <u>licensing</u> [registration] under this chapter if the student is enrolled in a state-approved course of instruction that consists of at least 500 [300] hours.

6 SECTION 13. Sections 455.159(a) and (b), Occupations Code, 7 are amended to read as follows:

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(a) An internship program must:

9 (1) meet the qualifications established by the 10 <u>department</u> [board];

11 (2) provide a student with a minimum of 40 hours of 12 hands-on massage therapy experience; and

13 (3) be conducted on the school grounds or in a clinic 14 or classroom setting provided by the massage school or massage 15 therapy instructor.

(b) A student must complete <u>at least</u> [the first] 250 hours of required training at a massage school or with a massage therapy instructor before the student is eligible to enter an internship program.

20 SECTION 14. Sections 455.160 and 455.161, Occupations Code, 21 are amended to read as follows:

22 Sec. 455.160. <u>LICENSE</u> [REGISTRATION] RENEWAL. (a) A 23 person <u>licensed</u> [registered] under this chapter must periodically 24 renew the person's <u>license</u> [certificate of registration]. The 25 <u>license</u> [certificate] expires unless the <u>license</u> [certificate] 26 holder submits an application for renewal accompanied by the 27 renewal fee prescribed by the department or by the late fee

1 prescribed by this section.

2 (b) The department shall adopt a system under which <u>licenses</u> 3 [certificates of registration] expire on various dates during the 4 year. Fees must be prorated so that a <u>licensed</u> [registered] person 5 pays only for that part of the renewal period for which the <u>license</u> 6 [registration] is issued until the expiration date of the <u>license</u> 7 [registration].

8 (c) A person who is otherwise eligible to renew a <u>license</u> 9 [certificate of registration] may renew an unexpired <u>license</u> 10 [registration] by paying the required renewal fee to the department 11 before the expiration date of the <u>license</u> [registration]. A person 12 whose <u>license</u> [registration] has expired may not engage in 13 activities that require <u>a license</u> [registration] until the <u>license</u> 14 [registration] has been renewed.

15 (d) A person whose <u>license</u> [registration] has been expired 16 for 90 days or less may renew the <u>license</u> [registration] by paying 17 to the department a renewal fee that is equal to 1-1/2 times the 18 normally required renewal fee.

(e) A person whose <u>license</u> [registration] has been expired
for more than 90 days but less than one year may renew the <u>license</u>
[registration] by paying to the department a renewal fee that is
equal to two times the normally required renewal fee.

(f) A person whose <u>license</u> [registration] has been expired for one year or more may not renew the <u>license</u> [registration]. The person may <u>obtain a license</u> [register] by complying with the requirements and procedures, including the examination requirements, for <u>obtaining a new license</u> [originally]

1 registering].

2 (g) Not later than the 30th day before the date a person's 3 <u>license</u> [registration] is scheduled to expire, the department shall 4 send written notice of the impending expiration to the person at the 5 person's last known address according to the records of the 6 department.

Sec. 455.161. RENEWAL OF EXPIRED <u>LICENSE</u> [REGISTRATION] OF OUT-OF-STATE PRACTITIONER. (a) A person who was registered <u>or</u> <u>licensed</u> in this state, moved to another state, and is currently registered or licensed and has been in practice in the other state for the two years preceding the date of application may <u>obtain a</u> <u>license</u> [register] without reexamination.

13 (b) The person must pay to the department a fee that is equal 14 to two times the normally required <u>license</u> renewal fee [for 15 registration].

Sec. 455.201. REFERRAL FROM PHYSICIAN. A person issued a <u>license</u> [certificate of registration] may receive referrals from a physician to administer massage therapy.

Sec. 455.202. PRACTICE BY MASSAGE ESTABLISHMENT. A massage establishment may employ only <u>licensed</u> [registered] massage therapists to perform massage therapy.

27 SECTION 17. Sections 455.203(a), (b), and (c), Occupations

1 Code, are amended to read as follows:

2 (a) A massage school must meet the minimum standards of
3 operation established by <u>executive commissioner</u> [board] rule.

4 (b) An instructor must meet the minimum requirements
5 established by <u>executive commissioner</u> [board] rule.

6 (c) A massage school or massage therapy instructor <u>licensed</u> 7 [registered] under this chapter shall give each prospective student 8 a notice that clearly states the number of course hours that the 9 student must successfully complete before the student is eligible 10 to <u>hold</u> [register as] a massage therapist <u>license</u> under this 11 chapter.

SECTION 18. Section 455.204, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

14 Sec. 455.204. DISPLAY OF <u>LICENSE</u> [CERTIFICATE]. (a) A 15 person who holds a <u>license</u> [certificate of registration] shall 16 publicly display the <u>license</u> [certificate] as specified by the 17 department [board].

18 (b) Each massage establishment must post in plain sight the 19 <u>license</u> [certificate of registration] for each massage therapist 20 who practices in the massage establishment.

(c) Each massage school, massage establishment, massage therapy instructor, or massage therapist shall present the person's <u>license</u> [certificate of registration] on the request of the department, an authorized representative of the department, or a peace officer.

26 SECTION 19. Sections 455.205(b) and (c), Occupations Code, 27 are amended to read as follows:

(c) A person who is not <u>licensed</u> [registered] under this
chapter may not use the word "massage" on any form of advertising
unless the person is expressly exempt from the <u>licensing</u>
[registration] requirements of this chapter.

(a) The <u>department</u> [board] may refuse to issue a <u>license</u> [certificate of registration] to a person and shall suspend, revoke, or refuse to renew the <u>license</u> [certificate of registration] of a person or shall reprimand a person <u>licensed</u> [registered] under this chapter if the person:

(1) obtains a <u>license</u> [certificate of registration] by
 fraud, misrepresentation, or concealment of material facts;

25 (2) sells, barters, or offers to sell or barter a
 26 <u>license</u> [certificate of registration];

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(3) violates a rule adopted by the executive

1 commissioner [board];

2 engages in unprofessional conduct as defined by (4) 3 executive commissioner [board] rule that endangers or is likely to endanger the health, welfare, or safety of the public; 4

8 (b) The department shall revoke the license [certificate of 9 registration] of a person licensed [registered] as a massage 10 therapist or massage therapy instructor if:

(1) the person is convicted of, enters a plea of nolo 11 contendere or guilty to, or receives deferred adjudication for an 12 offense involving prostitution or another sexual offense; or 13

14 (2) the department determines the person has practiced 15 or administered massage therapy at or for a sexually oriented business. 16

17 (c) The department shall revoke the license [certificate of registration] of a person licensed [registered] as a massage school 18 19 or massage establishment if the department determines that:

(1) the school or establishment is a sexually oriented 20 21 business; or

SECTION 32. (a) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act, the Department of State Health Services shall prescribe the forms and procedures and the executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall adopt the rules

H.B. No. 1842 1 that are necessary to implement Chapter 455, Occupations Code, as 2 amended by this Act.

3 (b) The changes in law made by this Act with regard to the 4 requirements for issuing a license under Chapter 455, Occupations 5 Code, apply only to an application filed with the Department of 6 State Health Services on or after September 1, 2007. An application 7 filed before that date is governed by the law in effect immediately 8 before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is 9 continued in effect for that purpose.

The Department of State Health Services shall treat a 10 (c) person who holds a certificate of registration under Chapter 455, 11 Occupations Code, immediately before the effective date of this 12 Act, as if the person holds a license under Chapter 455, Occupations 13 14 Code, as amended by this Act. A person who holds a certificate of 15 registration under Chapter 455, Occupations Code, on the effective date of this Act is entitled to issuance of a license on expiration 16 of the certificate of registration if the person otherwise meets 17 the requirements for renewal of a license. 18

A person who holds a certificate of registration under 19 (d) Chapter 455, Occupations Code, immediately before the effective 20 21 date of this Act, or is issued a certificate of registration under Subsection (b) of this section, and otherwise complies with Chapter 22 23 455 is not subject to disciplinary action or penalties, including a 24 criminal penalty under Section 455.352, Occupations Code, as 25 amended by this Act, for failure to hold a license under Chapter 455 until the certificate of registration's expiration date. 26
