- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 455.001(1), (2), (3), (6), (7), and

- 14 issuance of [registration as] a massage therapist license.
- 15 (6) "Massage school" means an entity that:
- 16 (A) teaches at a minimum the course of
- 17 instruction required for <u>issuance of</u> [<u>registration as</u>] a massage
- 18 therapist <u>license</u>; and
- 19 (B) has at least two instructors.
- 20 (7) "Massage therapist" means a person who practices
- 21 or administers massage therapy to a client for compensation. The
- 22 term includes a licensed [registered] massage therapist,
- 23 therapeutic massage practitioner, massage technician, masseur,
- 24 masseuse, myotherapist, body massager, body rubber, or any

- 1 derivation of those titles.
- 2 (9) "Massage therapy instructor" means a <u>licensed</u>
- 3 [registered] massage therapist who provides to one or more students
- 4 instruction approved by the department in massage therapy.
- 5 SECTION 2. Sections 455.003 and 455.004, Occupations Code,

- 8 Massage therapy includes the application of hydrotherapy or
