A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to distributing certain information collected by the
- 3 Department of State Health Services to the public.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 108.006(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The council shall develop a statewide health care data
- 8 collection system to collect health care charges, utilization data,
- 9 provider quality data, and outcome data to facilitate the promotion
- 10 and accessibility of cost-effective, good quality health care. The
- 11 council shall:
- 12 (1) direct the collection, dissemination, and
- 13 analysis of data under this chapter;
- 14 (2) contract with the department to collect the data
- 15 under this chapter;
- 16 (3) adopt policies and rules necessary to carry out
- 17 this chapter, including rules concerning data collection
- 18 requirements;
- 19 (4) build on and not duplicate other data collection
- 20 required by state or federal law, by an accreditation organization,
- 21 or by board rule;
- 22 (5) working with appropriate agencies, review public
- 23 health data collection programs in this state and recommend, where
- 24 appropriate, consolidation of the programs and any legislation

- 1 necessary to effect the consolidation;
- 2 (6) assure that public use data is made available and
- 3 accessible to interested persons by posting the data on the
- 4 Internet and by making the data available to the public on request;
- 5 (7) prescribe by rule the process for providers to
- 6 submit data consistent with Section 108.009;
- 7 (8) adopt by rule and implement a methodology to
- 8 collect and disseminate data reflecting provider quality in
- 9 accordance with Section 108.010;
- 10 (9) make reports to the legislature, the governor, and
- 11 the public on:
- 12 (A) the charges and rate of change in the charges
- 13 for health care services in this state;
- 14 (B) the effectiveness of the council in carrying
- out the legislative intent of this chapter;
- 16 (C) if applicable, any recommendations on the
- 17 need for further legislation; and
- 18 (D) the quality and effectiveness of health care
- 19 and access to health care for all citizens of this state;
- 20 (10) develop an annual work plan and establish
- 21 priorities to accomplish its duties;
- 22 (11) provide consumer education on the interpretation
- 23 and understanding of the public use or provider quality data before
- 24 the data is disseminated to the public;
- 25 (12) work with the Health and Human Services
- 26 Commission and each health and human services agency that
- 27 administers a part of the state Medicaid program to avoid

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- 1 duplication of expenditures of state funds for computer systems,
- 2 staff, or services in the collection and analysis of data relating
- 3 to the state Medicaid program;
- 4 (13) work with the Department of Information Resources
- 5 in developing and implementing the statewide health care data
- 6 collection system and maintain consistency with Department of
- 7 Information Resources standards; and
- 8 (14) develop and implement a health care information
- 9 plan to be used by the department to:
- 10 (A) support public health and preventative
- 11 health initiatives;
- 12 (B) assist in the delivery of primary and
- 13 preventive health care services;
- 14 (C) facilitate the establishment of appropriate
- 15 benchmark data to measure performance improvements;
- 16 (D) establish and maintain a systematic approach
- 17 to the collection, storage, and analysis of health care data for
- 18 longitudinal, epidemiological, and policy impact studies; and
- 19 (E) develop and use system-based protocols to
- 20 identify individuals and populations at risk.
- 21 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
