- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 6.001, Family Code, is amended to read as
- 6 follows:
- 7 Sec. 6.001. INSUPPORTABILITY. On the petition of either
- 8 <u>spouse of</u> [party to] a marriage, the court may grant a divorce
- 9 without regard to fault if the marriage has become insupportable
- 10 because of discord or conflict of personalities that destroys the
- 11 legitimate ends of the marital relationship and prevents any
- 12 reasonable expectation of reconciliation.
- SECTION 2. Section 6.002, Family Code, is amended to read as
- 14 follows:
- Sec. 6.002. CRUELTY. The court shall [may] grant a divorce
- 16 in favor of one spouse if the other spouse is guilty of cruel
- 17 treatment toward the complaining spouse of a nature that renders
- 18 further living together insupportable.
- 19 SECTION 3. Section 6.003, Family Code, is amended to read as
- 20 follows:
- Sec. 6.003. ADULTERY. The court <u>shall</u> [may] grant a divorce
- in favor of one spouse if the other spouse has committed adultery.
- SECTION 4. Section 6.004(a), Family Code, is amended to

- 1 (a) The court <u>shall</u> [may] grant a divorce in favor of one
- 2 spouse if during the marriage the other spouse:
- 4 (2) has been imprisoned for at least one year in the

- 7 (3) has not been pardoned.
- 8 SECTION 5. Section 6.005, Family Code, is amended to read as
- 9 follows:
- 10 Sec. 6.005. ABANDONMENT. The court <u>shall</u> [may] grant a
- 11 divorce in favor of one spouse if the other spouse:
- 12 (1) left the complaining spouse with the intention of
- 13 abandonment; and
- 14 (2) remained away for at least one year.
- 15 SECTION 6. Section 7.001, Family Code, is amended to read as
- 16 follows:
- 17 Sec. 7.001. GENERAL RULE OF PROPERTY DIVISION. (a) In a
- 18 decree of divorce or annulment, the court shall order a division of
- 19 the estate of the spouses [parties] in a manner that the court deems
- 20 just and right, having due regard for the rights of each spouse
- 21 [party] and any children of the marriage.
- (b) In a decree of divorce granted on a ground described by
- 23 <u>Section 6.002, 6.003, 6.004, or 6.005, the court shall order a</u>
- 24 significantly disproportionate division of the estate of the
- 25 spouses in favor of the spouse who the court determines is least at

- 4 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
