## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the legislature's goal for energy efficiency in this
- 3 state and related energy efficiency programs.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 39.905, Utilities Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 39.905. GOAL FOR ENERGY EFFICIENCY. (a) It is the
- 8 goal of the legislature that:
- 9 (1) electric utilities will administer energy savings
- 10 incentive programs in a market-neutral, nondiscriminatory manner
- 11 but will not offer underlying competitive services;
- 12 (2) all customers, in all customer classes, have a
- 13 choice of and access to energy efficiency alternatives and other
- 14 choices from the market that allow each customer to reduce the
- 15 customer's energy consumption, peak demand, or [and reduce] energy
- 16 costs; and
- 17 (3) each electric utility will provide, through
- 18 market-based standard offer programs or limited, targeted,
- 19 market-transformation programs, incentives sufficient for retail
- 20 electric providers and competitive energy service providers to
- 21 acquire additional cost-effective energy efficiency equivalent to
- 22 at least 10 percent of the electric utility's annual growth in
- 23 demand.
- 24 (b) The commission shall provide oversight and adopt rules

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- and procedures, as necessary, to ensure that the goal of this
- 2 section is achieved by January 1, 2007 [2004].
- 3 (c) A standard offer program under Subsection (a)(3) must be
- 4 neutral with respect to technologies, equipment, or fuels and must
- 5 to the extent possible facilitate the full participation of
- 6 emerging technologies, including thermal, chemical, and mechanical
- 7 <u>technologies and electrical energy storage technologies.</u>
- 8 (d) The commission shall establish market transformation
- 9 programs for:
- 10 <u>(1) energy-smart schools;</u>
- 11 (2) appliance retirement and recycling;
- 12 (3) air conditioning system tune-ups; and
- 13 (4) the use of trees or other landscaping for energy
- 14 efficiency.
- 15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
