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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT 1 2 relating to funding for the continuing education of certain peace 3 officers. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 772.006, Government Code, is amended by 5 6 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows: (d) The criminal justice division shall administer a grant 7 program under which grants are awarded to support local law 8 9 enforcement agencies in this state in providing for the continuing education of persons licensed under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code. 10 11 Amounts awarded under this subsection: 12 (1) shall be based on need, as determined by the criminal justice division; and 13 14 (2) are in addition to amounts reimbursed under Section 1701.157, Occupations Code. 15 SECTION 2. Section 1701.157, Occupations Code, is amended 16 to read as follows: 17 Sec. 1701.157. MONEY ALLOCATED AND USED FOR CONTINUING 18 EDUCATION. (a) Not later than March 1 of each calendar year, the 19 comptroller shall allocate money deposited during the preceding 20 21 calendar year in the general revenue fund to the credit of the law 22 enforcement officer standards and education fund account to 23 reimburse local law enforcement agencies in this state, as provided 24 by this section, for expenses incurred during the preceding

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1	calendar year related to a purpose described by Subsection (b) [the
2	continuing education of persons licensed under this chapter as
3	follows:
4	[(1) 20 percent of the money is allocated to all local
5	law enforcement agencies in this state in equal shares; and
6	[(2) 80 percent of the money is allocated to all local
7	law enforcement agencies in this state in a share representing a
8	fixed amount for each position in the agency, as of January 1 of the
9	preceding calendar year, that is reserved to a person who:
10	[(A) is licensed under this chapter;
11	[(B) works as a peace officer on the average of at
12	least 32 hours a week; and
13	[(C) is compensated by a political subdivision of
14	this state at least at the minimum wage and is entitled to all
15	employee benefits offered to a peace officer by the political
16	subdivision].
17	(b) <u>A local law enforcement agency in this state that</u>
18	submits an application to the comptroller in the form and by the
19	deadline prescribed by the comptroller is entitled to reimbursement
20	from the comptroller for costs expended by the agency in a calendar
21	year to provide for the continuing education of persons licensed
22	under this chapter. The amount a local law enforcement agency is
23	reimbursed under this section may not exceed the maximum amount for
24	which the agency may be reimbursed as determined under Subsection
25	(c). Not later than November 1 of each calendar year, each local
26	law enforcement agency shall report to the comptroller the number
27	of agency positions described by Subsection $(c)(1)$ [$(a)(2)$] as of

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1 January 1 of that year. 2 (c) To determine the maximum amount of expenses in a calendar year for which a local law enforcement agency may be 3 4 reimbursed under this section, the comptroller must: (1) determine the total number of all positions in 5 6 local law enforcement agencies in this state that, as of January 1 7 of the calendar year for which expenses are being reimbursed, were reserved for persons who: 8 9 (A) are licensed under this chapter; 10 (B) work as peace officers on the average of at 11 least 32 hours a week; and (C) are compensated by a political subdivision of 12 this state at least at the minimum wage and are entitled to all 13 14 employee benefits offered to a peace officer by the political 15 subdivision; 16 (2) divide the total amount deposited to the credit of 17 the law enforcement officer standards and education fund account during the calendar year for which expenses are being reimbursed by 18 the total number of positions computed under Subdivision (1); and 19 (3) multiply the per position share computed under 20 21 Subdivision (2) by the number of filled positions in the local law enforcement agency during the calendar year for which expenses are 22 being reimbursed that meet the requirements of Subdivision (1). 23 24 (d) The head of a law enforcement agency shall maintain a 25 complete and detailed written record of expenses for which the agency seeks reimbursement under this section [money received and 26 spent by the agency under this section]. Money received under this 27

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section is subject to audit by the comptroller. Money spent under this section is subject to audit by the state auditor.

3 [(d) A local law enforcement agency shall use money received 4 under Subsection (a) only as necessary to ensure the continuing 5 education of persons licensed under this chapter or to provide 6 necessary training, as determined by the agency head, to full-time 7 fully paid law enforcement support personnel in the agency.]

8 (e) A local law enforcement agency may not use money 9 received under <u>this section</u> [Subsection (a)] to replace funds that 10 are provided to the agency by the county or municipality having 11 jurisdiction over the agency on a recurring basis for training law 12 enforcement officers [and support personnel].

13 SECTION 3. (a) If funds are available for that purpose, the 14 criminal justice division of the governor's office shall award the 15 first grants under Section 772.006(d), Government Code, as added by 16 this Act, in the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2005.

(b) The changes in law made by this Act to Section 1701.157,
Occupations Code, apply to reimbursements made on or after January
1, 2006, for expenses incurred by local law enforcement agencies
during calendar year 2005.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
