2	relating to the transfer of jurisdiction over the National Museum
3	of the Pacific War and other historical sites from the Parks and
4	Wildlife Department to the Texas Historical Commission.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Sections 442.001-442.018, Government Code, are
7	designated as Subchapter A, Chapter 442, Government Code, and a
8	heading to Subchapter A is added to read as follows:
9	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
10	SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 442, Government Code, as
11	added by this Act, is amended by adding Section 442.019 to read as
12	follows:
13	Sec. 442.019. TRANSFER OF HISTORICAL SITES FROM PARKS AND
14	WILDLIFE. (a) By interagency agreement, a historical site under
15	the jurisdiction of the Parks and Wildlife Department may be
16	transferred to the commission.
17	(b) If jurisdiction over a historical site is transferred
18	under this section, all rights, powers, duties, obligations,
19	functions, activities, property, and programs of the Parks and
20	Wildlife Department relating to the historical site are transferred
21	to the commission.
22	(c) On or after the transfer of jurisdiction over a
23	historical site, the commission may enter into an agreement with a
24	nonprofit corporation, including the Admiral Nimitz Foundation,

1	for the expansion, renovation, management, operation, or financial
2	support of the site.
3	SECTION 3. Subchapter Q, Chapter 22, Parks and Wildlife
4	Code, is redesignated as Subchapter B, Chapter 442, Government
5	Code, and amended to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER <u>B</u> [$\frac{1}{2}$]. NATIONAL MUSEUM OF THE PACIFIC WAR
7	[FLEET ADMIRAL CHESTER W. NIMITZ MEMORIAL NAVAL MUSEUM]
8	Sec. <u>442.051</u> [22.231]. MUSEUM <u>DEFINITION;</u> JURISDICTION.
9	(a) In this subchapter, "museum" means the National Museum of the
10	Pacific War.
11	(b) The museum [Fleet Admiral Chester W. Nimitz Memorial
12	Naval Museum] is under the jurisdiction of the commission
13	[department].
14	Sec. <u>442.052</u> [22.232]. POWERS OF <u>COMMISSION</u> [DEPARTMENT].
15	With respect to the $[Nimitz]$ museum and in addition to its other
16	powers and duties, the <u>commission</u> [department]:
17	(1) shall foster and commemorate the memory of the era
18	of supreme United States naval power upon the seas and the men and
19	women of the armed services whose gallant and selfless dedication
20	to duty made this era possible;
21	(2) shall administer the <u>museum</u> [Fleet Admiral Chester
22	W. Nimitz Memorial Naval Museum] at Fredericksburg;
23	(3) shall act in any other capacity relative to
24	preserving naval documents, relics, and other items of historical
25	interest;
26	(4) may employ and discharge a museum director and
27	other employees it deems necessary to fulfill its duties and

responsibilities within the limits of funds available; 1

2 (5) may accept on behalf of the State of Texas donations of money, property, and historical relics related to the 3 4 museum's theme; and

(6) may acquire property and historical relics by 5 6 purchase within the limits of funds available.

Sec. 442.053 [22.233]. REVENUE BONDS FOR MUSEUM. (a) 7 The 8 commission [department,] by resolution [of the commission,] may 9 request the Texas Public Finance Authority to issue revenue bonds or other revenue obligations to finance the repair, renovation, 10 improvement, expansion, and equipping of the [Nimitz] museum for 11 one or more projects not to exceed an aggregated estimated cost of 12 \$9 million. 13

On receipt of a request by the commission [department] 14 (b) 15 under this section, the Texas Public Finance Authority shall promptly issue the bonds or other revenue obligations under and in 16 17 accordance with Chapter 1232[, Government Code].

The commission [department] shall deposit the proceeds 18 (c) of revenue bonds or other revenue obligations issued under this 19 section to the credit of the National Museum of the Pacific War 20 account [Texas parks and wildlife conservation and capital account] 21 and may use the proceeds only to finance the repair, renovation, 22 improvement, expansion, and equipping of the museum. 23

24 (d) Notwithstanding any other law, the commission 25 [department] may contract with the Admiral Nimitz Foundation for the administration and operation of the museum, including any 26 27

necessary renovation, improvement, or expansion of the museum.

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1	(e) The <u>commission</u> [department] may accept contributions
2	from the Admiral Nimitz Foundation and other sources in connection
3	with the repair, renovation, improvement, expansion, equipping, or
4	operation of the museum.
5	Sec. 442.054. NATIONAL MUSEUM OF THE PACIFIC WAR ACCOUNT.
6	(a) The National Museum of the Pacific War account is a separate
7	account in the general revenue fund.
8	(b) The account consists of:
9	(1) transfers made to the account;
10	(2) revenue from the operation of the museum;
11	(3) grants and donations made by the Admiral Nimitz
12	Foundation and other sources; and
13	(4) income earned on investments of money in the
14	account.
15	(c) Appropriations to the commission for the preservation,
16	operation, or maintenance of the museum shall be deposited to the
17	credit of the account.
18	(d) The commission may use money in the account to
19	administer this subchapter, including to support the preservation,
20	repair, renovation, improvement, expansion, equipping, operation,
21	or maintenance of the museum or acquisition of historical items
22	appropriate to the museum.
23	(e) Any money in the account not used in a fiscal year
24	remains in the account. The account is exempt from the application
25	of Section 403.095.
26	Sec. 442.055. GRANTS; DONATIONS. The commission may accept
27	a grant or donation for any program or purpose of the museum.

H.B. No. 2025 SECTION 4. (a) On November 1, 2005, the following are transferred to the Texas Historical Commission:

3 (1) all powers, duties, obligations, and liabilities
4 of the Parks and Wildlife Department relating to the National
5 Museum of the Pacific War;

6 (2) all unobligated and unexpended funds appropriated 7 to the Parks and Wildlife Department designated for the 8 administration of the National Museum of the Pacific War;

9 (3) all equipment and property of the Parks and 10 Wildlife Department used for the administration of or related to 11 the National Museum of the Pacific War; and

(4) all files and other records of the Parks and
Wildlife Department kept by the department regarding the National
Museum of the Pacific War.

(b) A rule adopted by the Parks and Wildlife Department that is in effect immediately before November 1, 2005, and that relates to the National Museum of the Pacific War is, on November 1, 2005, a rule of the Texas Historical Commission and remains in effect until amended or repealed by the Texas Historical Commission.

(c) Any money in the Texas parks and wildlife conservation
and capital account deposited to the credit of the National Museum
of the Pacific War on October 31, 2005, is transferred on November
1, 2005, to the National Museum of the Pacific War account.

(d) The transfers under this Act do not diminish or impair
the rights of a holder of an outstanding bond or other obligation
issued by the Parks and Wildlife Department under former Section
22.233, Parks and Wildlife Code.

1 (e) Before November 1, 2005, the Parks and Wildlife 2 Department may agree with the Texas Historical Commission to 3 transfer any property of the Parks and Wildlife Department to the 4 Texas Historical Commission to implement the transfer required by 5 this Act.

6 (f) In the period beginning on the effective date of this 7 Act and ending on November 1, 2005, the Parks and Wildlife 8 Department shall continue to perform functions and activities under 9 Subchapter Q, Chapter 22, Parks and Wildlife Code, as if that 10 subchapter had not been amended by this Act, and the former law is 11 continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
