A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to veteran's employment preferences.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 657.001, Government Code, is amended by
5	adding Subdivision (1-a) and amending Subdivision (2) to read as
6	follows:
7	(1-a) "Minimum qualifications" means having the
8	ability to perform the essential tasks of a job.
9	(2) "Public entity" means <u>:</u>
10	(A) a state agency, including:
11	(i) a [public] department, commission,
12	board, <u>authority</u> , <u>office</u> , or <u>other</u> agency:
13	(a) in the executive branch or
14	legislative branch created by the constitution or a statute of this
15	state; or
16	(b) of state government, created
17	under the constitution or a statute, with statewide authority;
18	(ii) a university system or an institution
19	of higher education as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code;
20	<u>or</u>
21	(iii) the supreme court, the court of
22	criminal appeals, another entity in the judicial branch of state
23	government with statewide authority, or a court of appeals; or
24	(B) a county, municipality, district, or

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- 1 authority created under Section 52, Article III, or Section 59,
- 2 Article XVI, Texas Constitution, or any other political or
- 3 corporate body of this state.
- 4 SECTION 2. Sections 657.002(a) and (b), Government Code,
- 5 are amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) A veteran qualifies for a veteran's employment
- 7 preference if the veteran:
- 8 (1) served in the military for not less than 90
- 9 consecutive days during a national emergency declared in accordance
- 10 with federal law or was discharged from military service for an
- 11 established service-connected disability;
- 12 (2) was honorably discharged from military service;
- 13 and
- 14 (3) meets the minimum qualifications for the
- 15 position [is competent].
- 16 (b) A veteran's surviving spouse who has not remarried or an
- orphan of a veteran qualifies for a veteran's employment preference
- 18 if:
- 19 (1) the veteran was killed while on active duty;
- 20 (2) the veteran served in the military for not less
- 21 than 90 consecutive days during a national emergency declared in
- 22 accordance with federal law; and
- 23 (3) the spouse or orphan meets the minimum
- 24 qualifications for the position [is competent].
- SECTION 3. Sections 657.003(a), (b), and (c), Government
- 26 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 27 (a) An individual who qualifies for a veteran's employment

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preference is entitled to a preference in employment with or appointment to a public entity or for a public work [of this state] over other applicants for the same position who meet the minimum qualifications for the position [do not have a greater qualification].

- (b) An individual who has an established service-connected disability and is entitled to a veteran's employment preference is entitled to preference for employment or appointment in a position [for which a competitive examination is not held] over all other applicants for the same position without a service-connected disability and who meet the minimum qualifications for the position [do not have a greater qualification].
- requires a competitive examination under a merit system or civil service plan for selecting or promoting employees, an] individual entitled to a veteran's employment preference who meets the minimum qualifications [etherwise is qualified] for that position [and who has received at least the minimum required score for the test] is entitled to have an additional [a service] credit applied to the scoring system or mechanism the public entity uses to evaluate applications for employment [of 10 points added to the test score]. The additional credit for an [An] individual who has an established service-connected disability must be equal to 1-1/2 times the credit a nondisabled veteran receives under this section [is entitled to have a service credit of five additional points added to the individual's test score].
- SECTION 4. Section 657.007(b), Government Code, is amended

- 1 to read as follows:
- 2 (b) The preference granted under this section applies only
- 3 to the extent that a reduction in workforce by an employing public
- 4 entity involves other employees of <u>like status and seniority</u> [a
- 5 similar type or classification].
- 6 SECTION 5. Section 657.008(a), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (a) A public entity shall file quarterly with the
- 9 comptroller a report that states:
- 10 (1) any measures taken by the public entity to inform
- 11 individuals entitled to a hiring preference under this chapter of
- 12 their rights under this chapter;
- 13 (2) the appeals process available through the public
- 14 entity to an individual entitled to a hiring preference under this
- 15 chapter who alleges that the public entity violated the
- 16 individual's rights under this chapter;
- 17 (3) the percentage of the total number of employees
- 18 hired by the entity during the reporting period who are persons
- 19 entitled to a preference under this chapter; and
- (4) $\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$ the percentage of the total number of the
- 21 entity's employees who are persons entitled to a preference under
- 22 this chapter.
- 23 SECTION 6. Chapter 657, Government Code, is amended by
- 24 adding Section 657.010 to read as follows:
- Sec. 657.010. COMPLAINT PROCEDURE. (a) An individual who
- is entitled to a veteran's employment preference under this chapter
- 27 may appeal a hiring decision made by a public entity by filing a

- 1 written complaint with the public entity.
- 2 (b) The individual must state in the complaint:
- 3 (1) the name of the public entity; and
- 4 (2) the allegations that form the basis of the
- 5 <u>complaint.</u>
- 6 (c) Not later than the 30th day after the date the public
- 7 entity receives the complaint, the public entity shall inform the
- 8 individual in writing of the remedies available through the public
- 9 entity.
- 10 (d) If the public entity determines that an individual
- 11 should have been offered the position because of the preference
- 12 granted under this chapter, the public entity shall:
- 13 (1) take disciplinary action against the individual
- 14 responsible for making hiring decisions for the public entity; and
- 15 (2) offer to employ the applicant in the next position
- 16 that becomes available for which the individual meets the minimum
- 17 qualifications.
- SECTION 7. Sections 657.004(a) and (c), Government Code,
- 19 are repealed.
- 20 SECTION 8. The changes in law made by this Act to Chapter
- 21 657, Government Code, apply to an application for employment only
- 22 if the application is submitted on or after the effective date of
- 23 this Act. An application submitted before the effective date of
- 24 this Act is governed by the law in effect at the time of
- 25 application, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 26 purpose.
- 27 SECTION 9. The changes in law made by this Act to Chapter

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- 1 657, Government Code, apply to a contract or public work for which a public entity advertises or otherwise solicits bids, proposals, 2 offers, or qualifications only if the entity first advertises or 3 4 otherwise solicits bids, proposals, offers, or qualifications on or 5 after the effective date of this Act. A contract or public work for 6 which a public entity first advertised or otherwise solicited bids, proposals, offers, or qualifications before that date is governed 7 8 by the law in effect when the first advertisement or solicitation 9 was given, and the former law is continued in effect for that 10 purpose.
- SECTION 10. The changes in law made by this Act to Chapter 657, Government Code, apply to an entity that receives public money only if the entity receives the money on or after the effective date of this Act. An entity that received public money before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when the money was received, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
