5	SECTION 1. Subchapter G, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 61.3031 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 61.3031. EXEMPTION FOR RECOGNIZED INSTITUTION
8	RELATING TO ACUPUNCTURE. This subchapter does not apply to an
9	institution that has been certified or otherwise approved by the
10	Texas State Board of Acupuncture Examiners as provided by Section
11	205.101, Occupations Code.
12	SECTION 2. Section 205.101(a), Occupations Code, is amended
13	to read as follows:
14	(a) Subject to the advice and approval of the medical board,
15	the acupuncture board shall:
16	(1) establish qualifications for an acupuncturist to
17	practice in this state;
18	(2) establish minimum education and training
19	requirements necessary for the acupuncture board to recommend that
20	the medical board issue a license to practice acupuncture;
21	(3) administer an examination that is validated by
22	independent testing professionals for a license to practice
23	acupuncture;
24	(4) develop requirements for licensure by endorsement

No. 2153 1 of other states; 2 (5) prescribe the application form for a license to 3 practice acupuncture; 4 (6) make recommendations on applications for licenses 5 to practice acupuncture; 6 (7) establish the requirements for a tutorial program 7 for acupuncture students who have completed at least 48 semester 8 hours of college; [and] 9 (8) certify or otherwise approve institutions located in this state that provide the education or other training 10 necessary for an individual to qualify for a license to practice 11 12 acupuncture; (9) deny or withdraw certification or other approval 13 14 with regard to institutions described by Subdivision (8) that fail 15 to meet certification requirements or maintain other standards set by the acupuncture board or by this chapter; and 16 17 (10) recommend additional rules as are necessary to administer and enforce this chapter. 18 SECTION 3. Section 205.206(a), Occupations Code, is amended 19 to read as follows: 20 21 An institution located in this state that provides (a) education or other training necessary for an individual to qualify 22 to practice [A reputable] acupuncture [school], in addition to 23 24 meeting any certification requirements or other standards set by the acupuncture board, must: 25 (1) maintain a resident course 26 of instruction

equivalent to not less than six terms of four months each for a 27

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1 total of not less than 1,800 instructional hours;

2 (2) provide supervised patient treatment for at least
3 two terms of the resident course of instruction;

4 (3) maintain a course of instruction in
5 anatomy-histology, bacteriology, physiology, symptomatology,
6 pathology, meridian and point locations, hygiene, and public
7 health; and

8 (4) have the necessary teaching force and facilities9 for proper instruction in required subjects.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
