- 5 SECTION 1. Section 51.009, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsection (d) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (c) Each of the following shall be accounted for as
- 9 educational and general funds:
- 10 (1) net tuition, special course fees charged under
- 11 Sections 54.051(e) and (l), Education Code, lab fees, student
- 12 teaching fees, [hospital and clinic fees,] organized activity fees,
- 13 proceeds from the sale of educational and general equipment, and
- 14 indirect cost recovery fees; and
- 15 (2) hospital and clinic fees received by a state-owned
- 16 clinical care facility that is operated using general revenue fund
- 17 appropriations.
- 18 <u>(d) Hospital and clinic fees received by a clinical care</u>
- 19 facility, other than a facility described by Subsection (c)(2),
- 20 that is administered by an institution of higher education may not
- 21 be treated as a source of financing from outside general revenue
- 22 fund appropriations in reference to a requirement in the General
- 23 Appropriations Act that salaries, wages, and benefits of the
- 24 employees of the institution be paid in proportion to the source of

- 1 the funds from which the salary, wages, and benefits are paid.
- 2 SECTION 2. Section 51.009, Education Code, as amended by
- 3 this Act, applies to fees collected on or after the effective date
- 4 of this Act. A fee collected before that date is governed by the law
- 5 in effect when the fee is collected, and that law is continued in
- 6 effect for that purpose.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
