- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Article 46B.025, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 7 amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 8 (d) The court shall direct an expert to provide the expert's
- 9 report to the court and the appropriate parties in the form approved
- 10 by the Texas Correctional Office on Offenders with Medical or
- 11 Mental Impairments under Section 614.0032(b), Health and Safety
- 12 <u>Code</u>.

- 13 SECTION 2. Article 46B.026, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 14 amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 15 (c) As soon as practicable after the court receives a report
- 16 under this article, the court shall forward the report to the Texas
- 17 Correctional Office on Offenders with Medical or Mental Impairments
- 18 to enable that office to discharge its duties under Section
- 19 614.0032(b), Health and Safety Code.
- SECTION 3. Section 614.0032(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- 22 (b) The office, with the special assistance of committee
- 23 members appointed under Section 614.002(b)(1), shall review
- 24 examinations to determine the competency of defendants in criminal

- 1 cases to stand trial and periodically shall report findings made as
- 2 a result of the review to the legislature and the court of criminal
- 3 appeals. The office shall approve and make generally available in
- 4 electronic format a standard form for use by experts in reporting
- 5 competency examination results under Chapter 46B, Code of Criminal
- 6 Procedure.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
