- 5 SECTION 1. Section 161.081, Health and Safety Code, is

- 19 (6) [(5)] "Tobacco product" has the meaning assigned

- (7) $[\frac{(6)}{(6)}]$ "Wholesaler" has the meaning assigned by
- 22 Section 154.001 or 155.001, Tax Code, as applicable.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter H, Chapter 161, Health and Safety
- 24 Code, is amended by adding Section 161.0821 to read as follows:

- Sec. 161.0821. PURCHASE OF CIGARETTES OR TOBACCO PRODUCTS 1
- 2 BY PERSONS YOUNGER THAN 18 YEARS OF AGE PROHIBITED. (a) A person
- who is younger than 18 years of age commits an offense if the person 3
- 4 purchases or attempts to purchase cigarettes or tobacco products.
- 5 (b) An offense under this section is a Class C misdemeanor.
- 6 SECTION 3. Subsection (a) of Section 285.063, Health and 7 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

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- The adoption or abolition of the tax or change in the tax rate takes effect on the first day of the first calendar quarter occurring after the expiration of the first complete calendar 10 quarter occurring after the date on which the comptroller receives a notice of the results of the election. Following an election to adopt the tax under this section, the district must submit to the comptroller a description of the boundaries of the district and a 15 map of the district clearly showing the district's boundaries at the same time it submits the results of the election held as provided by this chapter.

- SECTION 7. Sections 221.002(b) and (c), Insurance Code, are amended to read as follows:

 17 include the total gross amounts of premiums, <u>membership fees</u>,
 18 <u>assessments</u>, <u>dues</u>, <u>revenues</u>, <u>and any other considerations on</u>
 19 <u>insurance</u> written by the insurer in a calendar year from any kind of
 20 insurance written on <u>each and every kind of</u> property or risks

- 12 business of the retailer.
- 13 (d) If neither the possession of a taxable item [tangible
- 14 personal property] is taken at nor shipment or delivery of the item
- 15 [property] is made from the retailer's place of business in this
- 16 state, the sale is consummated at:
- 17 (1) the retailer's place of business in this state
- 18 where the order is received; or
- 19 (2) if the order is not received at a place of business
- of the retailer, the place of business from which the retailer's
- 21 salesman who took the order operates.
- (e) A sale of a taxable item [tangible personal property] is
- 23 consummated at the location in this state to which the item
- 24 [property] is shipped or delivered or at which possession is taken
- 25 by the customer if transfer of possession of the item [property]
- 26 occurs at, or shipment or delivery of the item [property]
- 27 originates from, a location in this state other than a place of

- business of the retailer and if:
- 2 (1) the retailer is an itinerant vendor who has no
- 3 place of business;
- 4 (2) the retailer's place of business where the
- 5 purchase order is initially received or from which the retailer's
- 6 salesman who took the order operates is outside this state; or
- 7 (3) the purchaser places the order directly with the
- 8 retailer's supplier and the property is shipped or delivered
- 9 directly to the purchaser by the supplier.
- 10 (m) A sale of a service described in Section 151.0047 to
- 11 remodel, repair, or restore nonresidential real property is
- 12 consummated at the location of the job site. However, if the job
- 13 <u>site includes areas in multiple municipalities then the sale is</u>
- 14 consummated at:
- 15 <u>(1)</u> the retailers place of business in this state
- 16 where the order is received; or
- 17 (2) if the order is not received at a place of business
- of the retailer, the place of business from which the retailer's
- 19 <u>salesman who took the order operates.</u>
- SECTION 61. Section 323.503, Tax Code, is amended to read as
- 21 follows:
- Section 323.503. STATE'S SHARE. Before sending any money
- 23 to a county under this subchapter the comptroller shall deduct two
- 24 percent of the amount of the taxes collected within the county
- 25 during the period for which a distribution is made as the state's
- 26 charge for its services under this chapter and shall[, subject to

- 6 (a) To defray the expenses incurred in the administration of
- 7 this title, an assessment is imposed on each <u>telecommunications</u>
- 8 utility, electric [public] utility, retail electric provider, and
- 9 electric cooperative within the jurisdiction of the commission that
- 10 serves the ultimate consumer, including each interexchange
- 11 telecommunications carrier.
- 12 (b) An assessment under this section is equal to one sixth
- 13 of one percent of the telecommunications utility's electric
- 14 [public] utility's, retail electric provider's, or electric
- 15 cooperative's gross receipts from rates charged to the ultimate
- 16 consumer in this state.
- 17 SECTION 63. Section 16.002(b), Utilities Code, is amended

- 3 SECTION 65. The changes made by this Act to Section 201.102,
- 4 Tax Code, apply to a refund claim or determination under Chapter
- 5 111, Tax Code, without regard to whether the taxes that are the
- 6 subject of the refund claim or determination were due before, on, or
- 7 after the effective date of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 66. The changes made by this Act to Section 111.009,
- 9 Tax Code, apply to a petition for redetermination filed on or after
- 10 the effective date of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 67. Effective date. This Act takes effect October
- 12 1, 2005.
