relating to the speed limit on certain highways in rural counties. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 545.353, Transportation Code, is amended

5 by adding Subsection (h-1) and amending Subsection (i) to read as 6 follows:

7 (h-1) Notwithstanding Section 545.352(b), the commission 8 may establish a speed limit of 80 miles per hour in daytime on a part 9 of Interstate Highway 10 or Interstate Highway 20 in Crockett, 10 Culberson, Hudspeth, Jeff Davis, Kerr, Kimble, Pecos, Reeves, 11 Sutton, or Ward County if the commission determines that 80 miles 12 per hour in daytime is a reasonable and safe speed for that part of 13 the highway.

14 (i) The speed <u>limits</u> [limit] authorized by <u>Subsections</u>
15 [<u>Subsection</u>] (h) and (h-1) do [does] not apply to:
