1 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only 2 to the forfeiture of contraband used in the commission of an offense under Chapter 49, Penal Code, on or after the effective date of this 3 4 Act. Forfeiture of contraband used in the commission of an offense under Chapter 49, Penal Code, before the effective date of this Act 5 6 is covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes 7 of this section, an offense was committed before the effective date 8 of this Act if any element of the offense was committed before that 9 date. 10

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
