5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is					
6	amended by adding Section 1702.047 to read as follows:					
7	Sec. 1702.047. ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF. The department shall					
8	designate a department employee who shall report directly to the					
9	board. The employee designated under this section shall assist the					
10	board in the administration of the board's duties.					
11	SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is					

- 12 amended by adding Section 1702.0611 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1702.0611. RULEMAKING PROCEDURES. (a) The board

  shall adopt rules under this chapter subject to the approval of the

  Public Safety Commission as provided by this section.
- 16 <u>(b) Before adopting a rule under this chapter, the board</u>
  17 must:
- (1) determine the need for the proposed rule;
- 19 (2) work with persons who will be affected by the rule
  20 to ensure consideration of all relevant issues regarding the
  21 proposed rule;
- 22 <u>(3) consult with an attorney in the department's</u>
  23 <u>regulatory licensing service to draft the rule and ensure that the</u>
  24 proposed rule complies with statutory requirements regarding

## 1 <u>administrative rules; and</u>

- 2 (4) submit the proposed rule to the department's
  3 general counsel, director, and chief accountant for consideration
  4 of the proposed rule's impact on the department and to ensure that
- 5 the proposed rule is within the board's authority.
- 6 (c) On the completion of the required publication and
  7 comment periods under Chapter 2001, Government Code, the Public
  8 Safety Commission may return the proposed rule to the board if the
  9 commission identifies a problem with the rule that must be resolved
  10 before the rule is approved.
- (d) On approval of the proposed rule by the Public Safety

  Commission, the board shall comply with the requirements of Chapter

  2001, Government Code, for final adoption of the rule.
- SECTION 3. Section 1702.062(a), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 16 (a) The commission by rule shall establish reasonable and
  17 necessary fees that produce sufficient revenue to administer this
  18 chapter. The fees may not produce unnecessary fund balances and may

3 SECTION 4. Section 1702.163(a), Occupations Code, is

- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 (a) The <u>board</u> [<u>commission</u>] may not issue a security officer 6 commission to an applicant employed by a license holder unless the 7 applicant submits evidence satisfactory to the <u>board</u> [<u>commission</u>]
- 8 that the applicant has:
- 9 (1) completed the basic training course at a school or under an instructor approved by the <u>board</u> [commission];
- 11 (2) met each qualification established by this chapter 12 and board [commission] rule;
- 13 (3) achieved the score required by the <u>board</u>
  14 [commission] on the examination under Section 1702.1685; and
- (4) demonstrated to the satisfaction of the firearm training instructor that the applicant has complied with other board [commission] standards for minimum marksmanship competency with a handgun [shotgun].
- SECTION 5. Section 1702.282, Occupations Code, is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 22 (a) The <u>board</u> [commission] shall conduct a criminal history check, including a check of any criminal history record information 24 maintained by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, in the manner 25 provided by Subchapter F, Chapter 411, Government Code, on each 26 applicant for a license, registration, security officer 27 commission, letter of approval, permit, or certification. An

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- 1 applicant is not eligible for a license, registration, commission,
- 2 letter of approval, permit, or certification if the check reveals
- 3 that the applicant has committed an act that constitutes grounds
- 4 for the denial of the license, registration, commission, letter of
- 5 approval, permit, or certification. Except as provided by
- 6 <u>Subsection (d)</u>, <u>each</u> [<u>Each</u>] applicant shall include in the
- 7 application two complete sets of fingerprints on forms prescribed
- 8 by the  $\underline{\text{board}}$  [ $\underline{\text{commission}}$ ] accompanied by the fee set by the  $\underline{\text{board}}$
- 9 [commission].
- 10 (d) An applicant who is a peace officer is not required to
- 11 submit fingerprints with the applicant's application. On request,
- 12 the law enforcement agency or other entity that employs the peace
- 13 officer or the entity that maintains the peace officer's
- 14 fingerprints shall provide the fingerprints for the peace officer
- 15 to the board. The applicant shall provide sufficient information
- to the board to enable the board to obtain the fingerprints under
- 17 this subsection.
- 18 SECTION 6. Section 46.05, Penal Code, is amended by
- 19 amending Subsection (f) and adding Subsection (g) to read as
- 20 follows:
- 21 (f) It is a defense to prosecution under this section for
- 22 the possession of a chemical dispensing device that the actor is
- 23 [holds] a security officer [commission issued by the Texas
- 24 Commission on Private Security and has received training on the
- use of the chemical dispensing device by a training program that is:
- 26 (1) provided by the Commission on Law Enforcement
- 27 Officer Standards and Education; or

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- 1 (2) approved for the purposes described by this 2 subsection by the Texas [Commission on] Private Security Board of
- 3 the Department of Public Safety.
- 4 (g) In Subsection (f), "security officer" means a
- 5 commissioned security officer as defined by Section 1702.002,
- 6 Occupations Code, or a noncommissioned security officer registered
- 7 under Section 1702.221, Occupations Code.
- 8 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
