A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT
relating to quality improvement activities for certain subsidized
child-care services.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Subchapter G, Chapter 2308, Government Code, is
amended by adding Section 2308.3175 to read as follows:
Sec. 2308.3175. QUALITY IMPROVEMENT ACTIVITIES FOR
SUBSIDIZED CHILD-CARE SERVICES. (a) In this section, "subsidized
child-care services" means subsidized child-care services
administered by the commission and a board and funded wholly or
partly by federal child-care development funds.
(b) The commission by rule shall establish a program under
which a board awards grants to child-care providers and
community-based organizations for use in providing quality
improvement activities to improve the quality and availability of
subsidized child-care services in the workforce development area.
(c) The commission by rule shall prescribe eligibility
criteria for receipt of a grant under the program.
(d) In developing the program under this section, the
commission shall adopt a list of quality improvement activities for
which a provider or organization is eligible to receive funding
through the program. The list of activities must include:
(1) comprehensive consumer education encompassing:

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(A) parent education programs;

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1	(B) publication of quality indicators to
2	evaluate child-care services;
3	(C) data collection regarding child-care and
4	early childhood education programs; and
5	(D) parent referral services;
6	(2) professional development activities for
7	<pre>providers, including:</pre>
8	(A) training, educational materials, or
9	technical assistance;
10	(B) scholarship information and assistance; and
11	(C) strategies to increase salaries or other
12	<pre>forms of compensation;</pre>
13	(3) teacher training programs, mentoring programs, or
14	other programs or activities that promote early development of
15	language, literacy, and mathematical skills in young children;
16	(4) programs or activities that promote inclusive
17	<pre>child care;</pre>
18	(5) activities promoted by the Healthy Child Care
19	America program and other activities designed to promote the social
20	and emotional development of young children;
21	(6) child-care resource and referral services for
22	parents;
23	(7) use of infant and toddler specialists to educate
24	parents and provide training and technical assistance to child-care
25	providers; and
26	(8) other activities the commission determines will
27	increase parental choice and improve the quality and availability

- 2 (e) The commission shall allocate funds to the boards for
- 3 use in administering the program, subject to guidelines established
- 4 by the commission. To the extent allowed by federal law, the
- 5 commission may allocate federal child-care development funds for
- 6 the purposes of the program.
- 7 <u>(f) In developing and administering the program, the</u>
- 8 commission and each board shall ensure that local providers and
- 9 organizations have the option to choose which of the quality
- improvement activities described by Subsection (d) the provider or
- organization wants to provide under the program.
- 12 (g) The commission shall submit to the legislature an annual
- 13 report regarding the operation of the program during the preceding
- 14 year. At a minimum, the report must include the number and total
- amount of grants awarded by each board during the period covered by
- 16 the report. A board must provide information to the commission as
- 17 necessary to enable the commission to prepare the report required
- 18 by this subsection.
- 19 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 20 of this Act, the Texas Workforce Commission shall adopt rules
- 21 necessary for the implementation of Section 2308.3175, Government
- 22 Code, as added by this Act.
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
