10	SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 262, Family Code, is
11	amended by adding Sections 262.308 and 262.309 to read as follows:
12	Sec. 262.308. CONFIDENTIALITY. (a) All identifying
13	information, documentation, or other records regarding a person who
14	voluntarily delivers a child to a designated emergency infant care
15	provider under this subchapter is confidential and not subject to
16	release to any individual or entity except as provided by
17	Subsection (b).
18	(b) Any pleading or other document filed with a court under
19	this subchapter is confidential, is not public information for
20	purposes of Chapter 552, Government Code, and may not be released to
21	a person other than to a party in a suit regarding the child, the
22	party's attorney, or an attorney ad litem or guardian ad litem
23	appointed in the suit.
24	(c) In a suit concerning a child for whom the Department of

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1 Family and Protective Services assumes care, control, and custody 2 under this subchapter, the court shall close the hearing to the public unless the court finds that the interests of the child or the 3 4 public would be better served by opening the hearing to the public. (d) Unless the disclosure, receipt, or use is permitted by 5 6 this section, a person commits an offense if the person knowingly 7 discloses, receives, uses, or permits the use of information derived from records or files described by this section or 8 9 knowingly discloses identifying information concerning a person who voluntarily delivers a child to a designated emergency infant 10 care provider. An offense under this subsection is a Class B 11 12 misdemeanor. Sec. 262.309. SEARCH FOR RELATIVES NOT REQUIRED. 13 The 14 Department of Family and Protective Services is not required to 15 conduct a search for the relatives of a child for whom the

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16 <u>department assumes care, control, and custody under this</u> 17 <u>subchapter.</u>

SECTION 3. Section 263.3025(d), Family Code, is repealed.
SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies to a
child for whom the Department of Family and Protective Services
assumes responsibility under Subchapter D, Chapter 262, Family
Code, as amended by this Act, regardless of whether the department
assumed responsibility for the child before, on, or after the
effective date of this Act.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
