A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

_	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the tuition rebate program for certain undergraduates
- 3 at certain public institutions of higher education.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 54.0065(a), (c), and (i), Education
- 6 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) A qualified student is eligible for a rebate of a
- 8 portion of the undergraduate tuition the student has paid if the
- 9 student:
- 10 (1) is awarded a baccalaureate degree from a general
- 11 academic teaching institution within the period prescribed by
- 12 Section 56.462(1)(A) or (B), as applicable, to qualify for
- 13 forgiveness of a Texas B-On-time loan; and
- 14 (2) has attempted no more than three hours in excess of
- 15 the minimum number of semester credit hours required to complete
- 16 the degree, including:
- 17 (A) transfer credits; and
- 18 (B) course credit earned exclusively by
- 19 examination, except that, for purposes of this subsection, only the
- 20 number of semester credit hours earned exclusively by examination
- 21 in excess of nine semester credit hours is treated as hours
- 22 attempted.
- (c) A student who has transferred from another institution
- 24 of higher education shall provide the institution awarding the

- degree an official transcript from each institution attended by the
- 2 student in order that the period during which the student has been
- 3 <u>enrolled in a general academic teaching institution and the</u> total
- 4 number of hours attempted by the student can be verified.
- 5 (i) The coordinating board, in consultation with the
- 6 institutions of higher education, shall adopt rules for the
- 7 administration of this section, including a rule to allow an
- 8 otherwise eligible student to receive a rebate under this section
- 9 if the student is not awarded a baccalaureate degree within the
- 10 period required by Subsection (a)(1) solely as a result of a
- 11 hardship or other good cause.
- 12 SECTION 2. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies
- 13 only to a student who enters a general academic teaching
- 14 institution for the first time on or after the effective date of
- 15 this Act.
- 16 (b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 17 adopt the rule required by Section 54.0065(i), Education Code, as
- amended by this Act, relating to students who do not graduate within
- 19 the required time as a result of hardship or other good cause, as
- 20 soon as practicable after this Act takes effect. For that purpose,
- 21 the coordinating board may adopt the initial rule in the manner
- 22 provided by law for emergency rules.
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
