## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the release of a child support lien.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 157.321, Family Code, is amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 Sec. 157.321. DISCRETIONARY RELEASE OF LIEN. (a) A child
- 7 support lien claimant may at any time release a lien on all or part
- 8 of the property of the obligor or return seized property, without
- 9 liability, if assurance of payment is considered adequate by the
- 10 claimant or if the release or return will facilitate the collection
- of the arrearages. The release or return may not operate to prevent
- 12 future action to collect from the same or other property owned by
- 13 the obligor.
- 14 (b) A claimant may enter into a written agreement with the
- obligor for release of a lien on payment of an amount that is less
- 16 than the full amount of child support due, including any costs and
- 17 reasonable attorney's fees. The release must:
- 18 (1) be delivered to the Title IV-D agency;
- 19 (2) specifically state the amount of child support
- 20 that was paid by the obligor on or before the date the release is
- 21 executed and indicate whether that amount is inclusive or exclusive
- 22 of interest; and
- 23 (3) be accompanied by a copy of the written agreement
- 24 under which the obligor's payment of an amount that is less than the

- 1 amount of child support due is considered satisfaction for the full
- 2 amount, including accrued interest, at the time the release is
- 3 executed.
- 4 (c) A release under Subsection (b) does not prevent a future
- 5 action to impose a child support lien on the same property or other
- 6 property owned by the obligor for child support arrearages that
- 7 <u>accrue after the date of execution of the release of lien.</u>
- 8 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 9 to a child support lien release executed on or after the effective
- 10 date of this Act. A child support lien release executed before the
- 11 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 12 date the release was executed, and the former law is continued in
- 13 effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
