(16) "Service credit" means the amount of membership 13 14 service, [and] military service, and federal peace officer service ascribed to a person's account in the retirement system for which 15 16 all required contributions have been made to, and are being held by, 17 the retirement system. 18 SECTION 2. Section 813.001, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 19 Sec. 813.001. TYPES OF CREDITABLE SERVICE. The types of 20 21 service creditable in the retirement system are membership service, military service, federal peace officer service, and equivalent 22 23 membership service. SECTION 3. Section 813.101, Government Code, is amended to 24

REQUIRED DEPOSITS. 2 Sec. 813.101. DETERMINATION OF The 3 retirement system shall determine in each case the amount of money to be deposited by a member claiming credit for membership service, 4 5 [or] military service, or federal peace officer service previously 6 canceled or not previously established. The system may not provide 7 benefits based on the claimed service until the determined amount 8 has been fully paid.

(a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) or Section 813.304(d), military service or federal peace officer service is 5 creditable in a class of membership that includes a position held by 6 the member who performed the service after the date of release from 7 8 active military duty or employment as a federal peace officer.

9 (b) Military service <u>or federal peace officer service</u> 10 performed by a person who was a contributing member immediately 11 before the date the member began military duty <u>or employment as a</u> 12 <u>federal peace officer</u> may be credited, at the option of the member, 13 in the class of membership that includes the position held by the 14 member immediately before the date the member began the military 15 duty <u>or federal peace officer employment</u>.

SECTION 11. Section 813.304, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 813.304. USE OF MILITARY SERVICE CREDIT <u>OR FEDERAL</u> <u>PEACE OFFICER SERVICE CREDIT</u>. (a) The retirement system shall use military service credit <u>and federal peace officer service credit</u> in computing occupational disability retirement benefits and death benefits and in determining eligibility to select an optional death benefit plan.

(b) The retirement system shall use military service credit
 and federal peace officer service credit in computing service
 retirement or nonoccupational disability retirement benefits of a
 member of the employee class only if the member has, without

3 (c) The retirement system shall use military service credit 4 <u>and federal peace officer service credit</u> in computing service 5 retirement or nonoccupational disability retirement benefits of a 6 member of the elected class:

7 (1) only if the member has, without military service
8 credit <u>and federal peace officer service credit</u>, at least six years
9 of service credit in that class, if the military service credit <u>or</u>
10 <u>federal peace officer service credit</u> was established before January
11, 1978; or

(2) only if the member has enough service credit,
exclusive of the military service credit <u>and federal peace officer</u>
<u>service credit</u>, to be eligible for service retirement benefits at
age 60, if the military service credit <u>or federal peace officer</u>

17 (d) The board of trustees by rule may permit a person who retires with at least 10 years of service credit, excluding 18 military service credit or federal peace officer service credit, to 19 receive service retirement benefits as an elected officer for the 20 21 percentage of the person's military service credit or federal peace officer service credit, but not more than 100 percent, that is 22 derived by dividing the number of months served as an elected 23 24 officer by 96 months.

25 SECTION 12. Section 813.401, Government Code, is amended to 26 read as follows:

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Sec. 813.401. SERVICE CREDITABLE IN ELECTED CLASS. Service

Service creditable in the employee class of membership is: 11 membership service in a position included in that 12 (1)13 class; 14 (2) military service or federal peace officer service 15 established as provided by Subchapter D; (3) service creditable in or transferred from the 16 17 elected class as provided by Section 813.503; and 18 (4) administrative board service established as provided by Section 813.502. 19 20 SECTION 14. Section 813.503(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 21 A member may establish in, or have transferred to, the 22 (a) employee class all service credited in the elected class, if the 23 24 contributions made to establish the service in the elected class 25 equal or exceed contributions required of a member of the employee 26 class for the same amount of service during the same time and at the 27 same rate of compensation. A member or retiree who has, or had at

the time of retirement, at least eight years of service credit in the elected class of membership, exclusive of military service or <u>federal peace officer service</u>, may transfer service credit between classes before or after retirement.

5 SECTION 15. Section 814.1042(a), Government Code, is 6 amended to read as follows:

For the sole purpose of determining eligibility to 7 (a) 8 receive a service retirement annuity under Section 814.104(a)(2), the retirement system shall consider not more than 60 months, or 9 portions of months, of service performed for a Texas governmental 10 employer by a member who has at least five years of service credit, 11 12 excluding military service or federal peace officer service, in the employee class as if it were service for which credit is established 13 14 in the retirement system.

15 SECTION 16. Section 814.202(a), Government Code, is amended 16 to read as follows:

17 (a) A member is eligible to retire for a nonoccupational18 disability if the member has at least:

(1) 8 years of membership service credit in theelected class of membership;

(2) 6 years of membership service credit in the
 elected class plus 2 years of military service credit <u>or federal</u>
 <u>peace officer service credit</u> established before January 1, 1978;
 or

(3) 10 years of membership service credit in theemployee class of membership.

27 SECTION 17. Section 815.311(a), Government Code, is amended

1 to read as follows:

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2 (a) The retirement system shall deposit in a member's 3 individual account in the employees saving account the following 4 amounts:

5 (1) the amount of contributions to the retirement 6 system that is deducted from the member's compensation;

7 (2) the portion of a deposit required to reinstate
8 service credit previously canceled that represents only the amount
9 withdrawn;

10 (3) the portion of a deposit required to establish 11 service credit not previously established that represents only the 12 required contribution; and

13 (4) the portion of a deposit required to establish 14 military service credit <u>or federal peace officer service credit</u> 15 that represents only the member's contribution for that credit.

SECTION 18. Section 815.312(b), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

(b) The retirement system also shall deposit in the state
accumulation account the interest portion of the following deposits
made by members:

(1) deposits required to reinstate service previouslycanceled;

(2) deposits required to establish service credit notpreviously established; and

(3) deposits required to establish military service
 credit <u>or federal peace officer service credit</u>.

SECTION 19. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
