4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 29, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter K to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER K. COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMINATION
8	PREPARATION PILOT PROGRAM
9	Sec. 29.401. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
10	(1) "College entrance examination" means an
11	assessment instrument, such as the Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT)
12	and the American College Test (ACT), used by colleges and
13	universities in determining student admissions.
14	(2) "Preparation course" means a college entrance
15	examination preparation course.
16	(3) "Program" means the college entrance examination
17	preparation pilot program.
18	Sec. 29.402. ESTABLISHMENT OF PROGRAM; GUIDELINES AND
19	CRITERIA. (a) From funds appropriated for the purpose, the agency
20	shall establish a college entrance examination preparation pilot
21	program for the purpose of enabling a participating campus to offer
22	a college entrance examination preparation course to participating
23	students.
24	(b) The agency shall establish:

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1	(1) clear guidelines for the program, including
2	guidelines for participating campuses to follow in implementing the
3	program; and
4	(2) criteria for participating campuses to use in
5	selecting students to participate in the program.
6	Sec. 29.403. APPROVED VENDORS. The agency shall:
7	(1) establish a process for approving a vendor to
8	provide preparation course instruction for participating campuses;
9	and
10	(2) compile a list of approved vendors.
11	Sec. 29.404. CAMPUS ELIGIBILITY. A campus is eligible to
12	participate in the program only if at least 40 percent of the
13	students enrolled at the campus:
14	(1) are educationally disadvantaged; or
15	(2) are students at risk of dropping out of school as
16	defined by Section 29.081(d).
17	Sec. 29.405. APPLICATION PROCESS. (a) A campus, or a
18	school district on behalf of one or more district campuses, may
19	apply to the agency to participate in the program. The application
20	submitted by the campus or district must include a detailed
21	proposal that:
22	(1) describes the manner in which the campus proposes
23	<u>to:</u>
24	(A) recruit students to and achieve and maintain
25	strong student attendance and participation in the program; and
26	(B) assist participating students in completing
27	the preparation course and taking a college entrance examination;

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1	(2) describes how the campus proposes to schedule a
2	preparation course so that the course does not interfere with
3	participating students' regular curriculum requirements or
4	extracurricular activities;
5	(3) describes the manner in which the campus will be
6	responsible for the logistical requirements of the program;
7	(4) identifies a campus program coordinator; and
8	(5) describes the manner in which the campus will
9	report the effectiveness of the program to the agency.
10	(b) On the basis of applications submitted under this
11	section, the agency shall select to participate in the program
12	campuses that are eligible to participate under Section 29.404.
13	Sec. 29.406. FUNDING; CAMPUS IMPLEMENTATION OF PROGRAM.
14	(a) A participating campus is entitled to receive a grant from the
15	agency in an amount, determined by the agency, sufficient to
16	implement the program. The agency may not spend more than a total
17	of \$2 million in any fiscal biennium in awarding grants under this
18	section.
19	(b) A participating campus shall select a vendor from the
20	agency's list of approved vendors under Section 29.403 to offer a
21	college entrance examination preparation course at the campus.
22	(c) Using grant funds received under Subsection (a), a
23	participating campus must provide for the logistical requirements
24	of the preparation course, such as the course's location and
25	transportation to the course, and supplies, such as pencils and
26	calculators.
27	Sec. 29.407. EVALUATION; REPORT. (a) Each participating

campus shall, with the assistance of the vendor serving the campus, 1 report preparation course performance data to the agency. 2 The performance data must include aggregated student scores and 3 progress reports, including the college entrance examination 4 5 scores of participating students. 6 (b) The agency shall conduct an evaluation of the program. 7 Each participating campus shall cooperate with the agency to ensure 8 an effective evaluation. 9 (c) The agency shall report the results of the evaluation to the legislature not later than December 31, 2006. 10 Sec. 29.408. RULES. The commissioner shall adopt rules 11 12 necessary to administer this subchapter. Sec. 29.409. EXPIRATION. This subchapter expires August 1, 13 14 2007. 15 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date

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of this Act, the commissioner of education shall adopt rules for implementing the college entrance examination preparation pilot program as required by Subchapter K, Chapter 29, Education Code, as added by this Act. The commissioner of education shall make the college entrance examination preparation pilot program available for school campus participation for the 2005-2006 and 2006-2007 school years.

23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
