## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to transferring responsibility for the child-care
- 3 facilities for state employees from the Texas Building and
- 4 Procurement Commission to the Health and Human Services Commission.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 663.001, Government Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subdivision (3) and adding Subdivision (5) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (3) "Commission" means the Health and Human [General]
- 10 Services Commission.
- 11 (5) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
- 12 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
- SECTION 2. Section 663.002, Government Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 663.002. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES NOT AFFECTED.
- 16 Sections 663.003, 663.103, 663.104, and 663.105 do not affect the
- 17 duties or responsibilities of the Texas Building and Procurement
- 18 <u>Commission</u> [commission] under Section 2166.551.
- 19 SECTION 3. Section 663.003, Government Code, is amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- Sec. 663.003. GOOD FAITH STANDARD. The commission and the
- 22 executive commissioner [director of the commission] shall carry out
- their responsibilities under this chapter in good faith.
- SECTION 4. Section 663.051(b), Government Code, is amended

- 1 to read as follows:
- 2 (b) The executive commissioner may serve on the committee.
- 3 The commission may appoint to the committee:
- 4 (1) the executive director [directors] of [+
- $[\frac{\Lambda}{\Lambda}]$  the commission; and
- 6 [<del>(B)</del>] the Texas Department of Housing and
- 7 Community Affairs;
- 8 (2) two representatives of nonprofit organizations
- 9 involved with the delivery or support of child care services;
- 10 (3) a representative of the corporate child
- 11 development fund;
- 12 (4) a representative of child care providers;
- 13 (5) one or more state employees subject to the state
- 14 classification plan:
- 15 (A) each of whom has at least one child in a child
- 16 care facility; and
- 17 (B) if more than one is appointed, each of whom
- 18 resides in a different geographic area of the state; and
- 19 (6) one or more individuals knowledgeable in child
- 20 care services or the need of working individuals for child care
- 21 services.
- SECTION 5. Section 663.101(b), Government Code, is amended
- 23 to read as follows:
- 24 (b) The <u>executive commissioner</u> [<del>commission</del>] by rule may
- 25 establish methods to administer and supervise the child care
- 26 program.
- SECTION 6. Section 663.106, Government Code, is amended to

- 1 read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 663.106. LEASE TO CHILD CARE PROVIDER. The Texas
- 3 Building and Procurement Commission [commission] shall lease to a
- 4 child care provider selected by the Health and Human Services
- 5 Commission [commission] a site for a child care facility at a
- 6 reasonable rate.
- 7 SECTION 7. (a) On November 1, 2005:
- 8 (1) all functions and activities relating to Chapter
- 9 663, Government Code, performed by the Texas Building and
- 10 Procurement Commission immediately before that date are
- 11 transferred to the Health and Human Services Commission;
- 12 (2) a reference in an administrative rule to the Texas
- 13 Building and Procurement Commission that relates to Chapter 663,
- 14 Government Code, means the Health and Human Services Commission;
- 15 (3) a complaint, investigation, or other proceeding
- 16 before the Texas Building and Procurement Commission that is
- 17 related to Chapter 663, Government Code, is transferred without
- 18 change in status to the Health and Human Services Commission, and
- 19 the Health and Human Services Commission assumes, as appropriate
- 20 and without a change in status, the position of the Texas Building
- 21 and Procurement Commission in an action or proceeding to which the
- 22 Texas Building and Procurement Commission is a party;
- 23 (4) all money, contracts, and obligations of the Texas
- 24 Building and Procurement Commission related to Chapter 663,
- 25 Government Code, are transferred to the Health and Human Services
- 26 Commission;
- 27 (5) all personal property in the custody of the Texas

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- 1 Building and Procurement Commission related to Chapter 663,
- 2 Government Code, is transferred to the Health and Human Services
- 3 Commission; and
- 4 (6) the unexpended and unobligated balance of any
- 5 money appropriated by the legislature for the Texas Building and
- 6 Procurement Commission related to Chapter 663, Government Code, is
- 7 transferred to the Health and Human Services Commission.
- 8 (b) Subsection (a) of this section does not apply to the
- 9 Texas Building and Procurement Commission's responsibilities
- 10 regarding management of real property related to Chapter 663,
- 11 Government Code.
- 12 (c) Before November 1, 2005, the Texas Building and
- 13 Procurement Commission may agree with the Health and Human Services
- 14 Commission to transfer any property of the Texas Building and
- 15 Procurement Commission to the Health and Human Services Commission
- 16 to implement the transfer required by this section.
- 17 (d) In the period beginning on the effective date of this
- 18 Act and ending on November 1, 2005, the Texas Building and
- 19 Procurement Commission shall continue to perform functions and
- 20 activities under Chapter 663, Government Code, as if that chapter
- 21 had not been amended by this Act, and the former law is continued in
- 22 effect for that purpose.
- 23 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
