H.B. No. 2381

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to posting on the Internet the notice of a meeting of the 3 governing body of a county and certain districts and political subdivisions. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. Section 551.043, Government Code, is amended to 6 read as follows: 7 Sec. 551.043. TIME AND ACCESSIBILITY OF NOTICE; GENERAL 8 9 RULE. (a) The notice of a meeting of a governmental body must be posted in a place readily accessible to the general public at all 10 11 times for at least 72 hours before the scheduled time of the meeting, except as provided by Sections 551.044-551.046. 12 (b) If this chapter specifically requires or allows a 13 14 governmental body to post notice of a meeting on the Internet, the governmental body satisfies the requirement that the notice must be 15 16 posted in a place readily accessible to the general public at all times by continuously posting the notice on the Internet during the 17 prescribed period. 18 SECTION 2. Section 551.049, Government Code, is amended to 19 read as follows: 20 21 Sec. 551.049. COUNTY GOVERNMENTAL BODY: PLACE OF POSTING 22 NOTICE. A county governmental body: 23 (1) shall post notice of each meeting on a bulletin 24 board at a place convenient to the public in the county courthouse;

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2 (2) may post notice of each meeting on the county's 3 official Internet website.

4 SECTION 3. Section 551.053, Government Code, is amended to 5 read as follows:

6 Sec. 551.053. DISTRICT OR POLITICAL SUBDIVISION EXTENDING 7 INTO FOUR OR MORE COUNTIES: NOTICE TO PUBLIC, SECRETARY OF STATE, 8 AND COUNTY CLERK; PLACE OF POSTING NOTICE. (a) The governing body 9 of a water district or other district or political subdivision that 10 extends into four or more counties [shall]:

(1) <u>shall</u> post notice of each meeting at a place convenient to the public in the administrative office of the district or political subdivision;

14 (2) <u>may post notice of each meeting on the official</u>
 15 <u>Internet website of the district or political subdivision;</u>

16 <u>(3) shall</u> provide notice of each meeting to the 17 secretary of state; and

18 (4) shall [(3)] provide notice of each meeting to the 19 county clerk of the county in which the administrative office of the 20 district or political subdivision is located.

(b) The secretary of state shall post the notice provided under Subsection (a)(3) [(a)(2)] on the Internet. The secretary of state shall provide during regular office hours a computer terminal at a place convenient to the public in the office of the secretary of state that members of the public may use to view the notice.

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(c) A county clerk:

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(1) shall post the notice provided under Subsection

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1 (a)(4) [(a)(3)] on a bulletin board at a place convenient to the
2 public in the county courthouse; and

3 (2) may post each notice provided under Subsection
4 (a)(4) on the county's official Internet website.

5 SECTION 4. Section 551.054, Government Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:

Sec. 551.054. DISTRICT OR POLITICAL SUBDIVISION EXTENDING INTO FEWER THAN FOUR COUNTIES: NOTICE TO PUBLIC AND COUNTY CLERKS; PLACE OF POSTING NOTICE. (a) The governing body of a water district or other district or political subdivision that extends into fewer than four counties [shall]:

(1) <u>shall</u> post notice of each meeting at a place convenient to the public in the administrative office of the district or political subdivision;

15 (2) may post notice of each meeting on the official 16 Internet website of the district or political subdivision; and

17 <u>(3) shall</u> [(2)] provide notice of each meeting to the 18 county clerk of each county in which the district or political 19 subdivision is located.

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(b) A county clerk:

21 (1) shall post the notice provided under Subsection 22 (a)(3) [(a)(2)] on a bulletin board at a place convenient to the 23 public in the county courthouse; and

24 (2) may post each notice provided under Subsection
 25 (a)(3) on the county's official Internet website.

26 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
