4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 1151, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 1151.164 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1151.164. CHIEF APPRAISER TRAINING PROGRAM. (a) The
8	board shall implement a training program for newly appointed chief
9	appraisers and shall prescribe the curriculum for the training
10	program as provided by this section.
11	(b) The training program must provide the appointee with
12	information regarding:
13	(1) this chapter;
14	(2) the programs operated by the board;
15	(3) the role and functions of the board;
16	(4) the rules of the board, with an emphasis on the
17	rules that relate to ethical behavior;
18	(5) the role and functions of the chief appraiser, the
19	appraisal district board of directors, and the appraisal review
20	board;
21	(6) the importance of maintaining the independence of
22	an appraisal office from political pressure;
23	(7) the importance of prompt and courteous treatment
24	of the public;

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(8) the finance and budgeting requirements for an
appraisal district, including appropriate controls to ensure that
expenditures are proper; and
(9) the requirements of:
(A) the open meetings law, Chapter 551,
Government Code;
(B) the public information law, Chapter 552,
Government Code;
(C) the administrative procedure law, Chapter
2001, Government Code;
(D) other laws relating to public officials,
including conflict-of-interest laws; and
(E) the standards of ethics imposed by the
Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice.
(c) The training program implemented by the board under this
section must be provided by the board or by a provider approved by
the board. The board shall identify no less than two providers
before the board may finally approve a provider under this section.
SECTION 2. Chapter 5, Tax Code, is amended by adding Section
5.042 to read as follows:
Sec. 5.042. REQUIRED TRAINING FOR CHIEF APPRAISERS. (a)
Except as provided by this section, a person may not serve as a
chief appraiser for an appraisal district unless the person has
completed the course of training prescribed by Section 1151.164,
Occupations Code.
(b) A person may serve in a temporary, provisional, or

without completing the training required by this section. 1 2 (c) This section does not apply to a county assessor-collector who serves as chief appraiser under Section 3 4 6.05(c). SECTION 3. (a) The Board of Tax Professional Examiners 5 6 shall implement the training program required under Section 1151.164, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, not later than 7 8 January 1, 2006. 9 (b) A person is not required to complete the training program prescribed under Section 1151.164, Occupations Code, as 10 added by this Act, to serve as a chief appraiser for an appraisal 11 district until July 1, 2006. 12 (c) The change in law made by this Act by the enactment of 13 14 Section 5.042, Tax Code, applies only to a chief appraiser 15 appointed on or after July 1, 2006. SECTION 4. Section 5.042, Tax Code, takes effect July 1, 16 2006. 17 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 20 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005. 22
