2 relating to the issuance of a temporary tag for use on an

- 3 unregistered motor vehicle.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 501.022(d), Transportation Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (d) Subsection (c) does not apply to a motor vehicle
- 8 operated on a public highway in this state with a metal dealer's
- 9 license plate or a dealer's or buyer's temporary [cardboard] tag
- 10 attached to the vehicle as provided by Chapter 503.
- 11 SECTION 2. Sections 503.038(a) and (c), Transportation
- 12 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 13 (a) The department may cancel a dealer's general
- 14 distinguishing number if the dealer:
- 15 (1) falsifies or forges a title document, including an
- 16 affidavit making application for a certified copy of a title;
- 17 (2) files a false or forged tax document, including a
- 18 sales tax affidavit;
- 19 (3) fails to take assignment of any basic evidence of
- 20 ownership, including a certificate of title or manufacturer's
- 21 certificate, for a vehicle the dealer acquires;
- 22 (4) fails to assign any basic evidence of ownership,
- including a certificate of title or manufacturer's certificate, for
- 24 a vehicle the dealer sells;

- 1 (5) uses or permits the use of a metal dealer's license
- 2 plate or a dealer's temporary [cardboard] tag on a vehicle that the
- 3 dealer does not own or control or that is not in stock and offered
- 4 for sale;
- 5 (6) makes a material misrepresentation in an
- 6 application or other information filed with the department;
- 7 (7) fails to maintain the qualifications for a general
- 8 distinguishing number;
- 9 (8) fails to provide to the department within 30 days
- 10 after the date of demand by the department satisfactory and
- 11 reasonable evidence that the person is regularly and actively
- 12 engaged in business as a wholesale or retail dealer;
- 13 (9) has been licensed for at least 12 months and has
- 14 not assigned at least five vehicles during the previous 12-month
- 15 period;
- 16 (10) has failed to demonstrate compliance with
- 17 Sections 23.12, 23.121, and 23.122, Tax Code;
- 18 (11) uses or allows the use of the dealer's general
- 19 distinguishing number or the location for which the general
- 20 distinguishing number is issued to avoid the requirements of this
- 21 chapter;
- 22 (12) misuses or allows the misuse of a temporary
- 23 [cardboard] tag authorized under this chapter;
- 24 (13) refuses to show on a buyer's temporary
- 25 [cardboard] tag the date of sale or other reasonable information
- 26 required by the department; or
- 27 (14) otherwise violates this chapter or a rule adopted

- 1 under this chapter.
- 2 (c) A person whose general distinguishing number is
- 3 canceled under this chapter shall surrender to a representative of
- 4 the department each license, license plate, temporary [cardboard]
- 5 tag, sticker, and receipt issued under this chapter not later than
- 6 the 10th day after the date the general distinguishing number is
- 7 canceled. The department shall direct any peace officer to secure
- 8 and return to the department any plate, tag, sticker, or receipt of
- 9 a person who does not comply with this subsection.
- SECTION 3. The heading to Section 503.062, Transportation
- 11 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 503.062. DEALER'S TEMPORARY [CARDBOARD] TAGS.
- SECTION 4. Section 503.062, Transportation Code, is amended
- 14 by amending Subsections (a) and (d) and adding Subsection (d-1) to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 (a) A dealer may issue a temporary [cardboard] tag, as
- 17 authorized by the department, for use on a [an unregistered]
- 18 vehicle by the dealer or the dealer's employees only to:
- 19 (1) demonstrate or cause to be demonstrated to a
- 20 prospective buyer the vehicle for sale purposes only;
- 21 (2) convey or cause to be conveyed the vehicle:
- 22 (A) from one of the dealer's places of business
- 23 in this state to another of the dealer's places of business in this
- 24 state;
- 25 (B) from the dealer's place of business to a
- 26 place the vehicle is to be repaired, reconditioned, or serviced;
- 27 (C) from the state line or a location in this

- 1 state where the vehicle is unloaded to the dealer's place of
- 2 business;
- 3 (D) from the dealer's place of business to a
- 4 place of business of another dealer;
- 5 (E) from the point of purchase by the dealer to
- 6 the dealer's place of business; or
- 7 (F) to road test the vehicle; or
- 8 (3) use the vehicle for or allow its use by a
- 9 charitable organization.
- 10 (d) The department [may not issue a dealer temporary
- 11 cardboard tag or contract for the issuance of a dealer temporary
- 12 cardboard tag but] shall prescribe:
- 13 (1) the specifications, form, and color of a dealer
- 14 temporary [cardboard] tag; and
- 15 (2) the period for which a tag may be used for or by a
- 16 charitable organization.
- 17 (d-1) The department by rule may issue a dealer temporary
- 18 tag or contract for the issuance of a dealer temporary tag. If the
- 19 department issues or contracts for issuance of a dealer temporary
- 20 tag, the department's plan shall include the following provisions:
- 21 (1) the plan must provide for access to temporary tags
- 22 by all dealers, without regard to whether or not a dealer has access
- 23 to the internet;
- 24 (2) the plan must establish official fees for issuance
- of the dealer temporary tag. Fees must be reasonable and not more
- 26 than the amount necessary to allow the department to recover all
- 27 <u>costs to the department associated with the issua</u>nce or contract to

- 1 issue dealer temporary tags;
- 2 (3) the plan must ensure availability of the dealer
- 3 temporary tag during reasonable business hours of the dealer;
- 4 (4) if the plan includes electronic components or the
- 5 use of the internet, the plan must provide for redundancy of
- 6 processes and include an alternate procedure when the system is not
- 7 <u>functioning;</u>
- 8 (5) the plan must provide for access to appropriate
- 9 system information by any federal, state, or local agency; and
- 10 (6) if a dealer has a current and valid general
- distinguishing number, the dealer's ability to issue temporary tags
- 12 cannot be restricted without application of the administrative
- 13 contested case process.
- 14 SECTION 5. The heading to Section 503.0625, Transportation
- 15 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 503.0625. CONVERTER'S TEMPORARY [CARDBOARD] TAGS.
- 17 SECTION 6. Section 503.0625, Transportation Code, is
- 18 amended by amending Subsections (b), (e), and (f) and adding
- 19 Subsection (e-1) to read as follows:
- 20 (b) A converter may issue a temporary [cardboard] tag, as
- 21 <u>authorized by the department</u>, for use on an unregistered vehicle by
- the converter or the converter's employees only to:
- 23 (1) demonstrate or cause to be demonstrated to a
- 24 prospective buyer who is an employee of a franchised motor vehicle
- 25 dealer the vehicle; or
- 26 (2) convey or cause to be conveyed the vehicle:
- 27 (A) from one of the converter's places of

- 1 business in this state to another of the converter's places of
- 2 business in this state;
- 3 (B) from the converter's place of business to a
- 4 place the vehicle is to be assembled, repaired, reconditioned,
- 5 modified, or serviced;
- 6 (C) from the state line or a location in this
- 7 state where the vehicle is unloaded to the converter's place of
- 8 business;
- 9 (D) from the converter's place of business to a
- 10 place of business of a franchised motor vehicle dealer; or
- 11 (E) to road test the vehicle.
- 12 (e) The department [may not issue a converter temporary
- 13 cardboard tag or contract for the issuance of a converter temporary
- 14 cardboard tag but] shall prescribe the specifications, form, and
- color of a converter temporary [cardboard] tag.
- 16 (e-1) The department by rule may issue a converter's
- 17 temporary tag or contract for the issuance of a converter's
- 18 temporary tag. If the department issues or contracts for issuance
- of a converter's temporary tag, the department's plan shall include
- 20 the following provisions:
- 21 (1) the plan must provide for access to temporary tags
- 22 by all converters, without regard to whether or not a converter has
- 23 <u>access to the internet;</u>
- 24 (2) the plan must establish official fees for issuance
- of the converter's temporary tag. Fees must be reasonable and not
- 26 more than the amount necessary to allow the department to recover
- 27 all costs to the department; associated with the issuance or

- 1 contract to issue dealer temporary tags;
- 2 (3) the plan must ensure availability of the
- 3 converter's temporary tag during reasonable business hours of the
- 4 converter;
- 5 (4) if the plan includes electronic components or the
- 6 use of the internet, the plan must provide for redundancy of
- 7 processes and include a procedure by which a temporary tag may be
- 8 issued when the system is not functioning;
- 9 (5) the plan must provide for access to appropriate
- 10 system information by any federal, state, or local agency; and
- 11 (6) if a converter has a current and valid converter's
- 12 license, the converter's ability to issue temporary tags cannot be
- 13 restricted without application of the administrative contested
- case process.
- 15 (f) A converter or employee of a converter may not use a
- 16 temporary [cardboard] tag issued under this section as
- 17 authorization to operate a vehicle for the converter's or the
- 18 employee's personal use.
- 19 SECTION 7. The heading to Section 503.063, Transportation
- 20 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 21 Sec. 503.063. BUYER'S TEMPORARY [CARDBOARD] TAGS.
- 22 SECTION 8. Sections 503.063(a), (b), (c), (e), and (f),
- 23 Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 24 (a) At the time of delivery of a vehicle to the vehicle buyer
- or lessee, a dealer must issue:
- 26 (1) [Except as provided by this section, a dealer may
- 27 <u>issue to a person who buys an unregistered vehicle</u>] one temporary

- 1 [cardboard] buyer's tag for the vehicle; or
- 2 (2) if the dealer has been deputized as a deputy
- 3 <u>assessor-collector under Section 502.112</u>, a license plate or set of
- 4 plates or a device that, when attached to the vehicle as prescribed
- 5 by the department, is the registration insignia for the period for
- 6 which it is issued.
- 7 (b) The [Except as provided by this section, the] buyer's
- 8 tag is valid for the operation of the vehicle until the earlier of:
 - (1) the date on which the vehicle is registered; or
- 10 (2) the 45th [21st] day after the date of purchase.
- 11 (c) The dealer[÷
- 12 [(1) must show in ink on the buyer's tag the actual
- 13 date of sale and any other required information; and
- 14 $\left[\frac{(2)}{}\right]$ is responsible for <u>affixing</u> [displaying] the tag
- 15 <u>to the vehicle</u>.

- 16 (e) The department [may not issue a buyer's tag or contract
- 17 for the issuance of a buyer's tag but] shall prescribe the
- 18 specifications, color, and form of a buyer's tag.
- (f) The department by rule may issue a buyer's tag or
- 20 contract for the issuance of a buyer's tag. If the department
- 21 <u>issues or contracts for issuance of a buyer's tag, the department's</u>
- 22 plan shall include the following provisions: [A dealer may issue an
- 23 additional temporary cardboard buyer's tag to a person after the
- 24 expiration of 21 days after the issue of a temporary cardboard
- 25 buyer's tag, and the person may operate the vehicle for which the
- 26 tag was issued on the additional temporary cardboard buyer's tag if
- 27 the dealer has been unable to obtain on behalf of the vehicle's

- 1 owner the necessary documents to obtain permanent metal license
- 2 plates because the documents are in the possession of a lienholder
- 3 who has not complied with the terms of Section 501.115(a) of this
- 4 code. An additional tag issued under the terms of this subsection
- 5 is valid for a maximum of 21 days after the date of issue.
- 6 (1) the plan must provide for access to temporary tags
- 7 by all dealers, without regard to whether or not a dealer has access
- 8 to the internet;
- 9 (2) the plan must establish official fees for issuance
- of the buyer's tag. Fees must be reasonable and not more than the
- amount necessary to allow the department to recover all costs to the
- 12 department associated with the issuance or contract to issue
- buyer's tags;
- 14 (3) the plan must ensure availability of the buyer's
- 15 tag during reasonable business hours of the dealer;
- 16 (4) if the plan includes electronic components or the
- 17 use of the internet, the plan must provide for redundancy of
- processes and include a procedure by which a temporary tag may be
- 19 issued when the system is not functioning;
- 20 (5) the plan must provide for access to appropriate
- 21 system information by any federal, state, or local agency; and
- 22 (6) if a dealer has a current and valid general
- 23 distinguishing number, the dealer's ability to issue buyer's tags
- 24 cannot be restricted without application of the administrative
- 25 contested case process.
- SECTION 9. Section 503.067, Transportation Code, is amended
- 27 to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 503.067. UNAUTHORIZED REPRODUCTION OF TEMPORARY
- 2 [CARDBOARD] TAGS. (a) A person other than a dealer may not produce
- 3 or reproduce a buyer's or dealer's temporary [cardboard] tag.
- 4 (b) A person may not operate a vehicle that displays an
- 5 unauthorized temporary [cardboard] tag.
- 6 SECTION 10. Sections 503.068(a), (b), and (c),
- 7 Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) A dealer or an employee of a dealer may not use a
- 9 dealer's temporary [cardboard] tag as authorization to operate a
- 10 vehicle for the dealer's or the employee's personal use.
- 11 (b) A person may not use a metal dealer's license plate or
- 12 dealer's temporary [cardboard] tag on:
- 13 (1) a service or work vehicle; or
- 14 (2) a commercial vehicle that is carrying a load.
- 15 (c) For purposes of this section, a boat trailer carrying a
- 16 boat is not a commercial vehicle carrying a load. A dealer
- 17 complying with this chapter may affix to the rear of a boat trailer
- 18 the dealer owns or sells a metal dealer's license plate or temporary
- 19 [cardboard] tag issued under Section 503.061, 503.062, or 503.063.
- SECTION 11. Section 503.069(a), Transportation Code, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- 22 (a) A license plate, other than an in-transit license plate,
- or a temporary [cardboard] tag issued under this chapter shall be
- 24 displayed in accordance with board rules.
- 25 SECTION 12. Section 601.002(12), Transportation Code, is
- 26 amended to read as follows:
- 27 (12) "Vehicle registration" means:

- 1 (A) a registration certificate, registration
- 2 receipt, or number plate issued under Chapter 502; or
- 3 (B) a dealer's license plate or temporary
- 4 [cardboard] tag issued under Chapter 503.
- 5 SECTION 13. The law applicable to the issuance of temporary
- 6 tags on January 1, 2005 remains in force and effect until the new
- 7 plan becomes functional, at which time it shall be revoked and
- 8 become invalid.
- 9 SECTION 14. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 10 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 11 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 12 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
