## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the allocation of federal funds directed to be used to
3	support graduate medical education in connection with the state
4	Medicaid program.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 32.0315, Human Resources Code, is
7	amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (a-1) and
8	(a-2) to read as follows:
9	(a-1) For purposes of allocating funds to a teaching
10	hospital under this section, the department shall establish a
11	separate formula for funds used to support the training of resident
12	physicians in an accredited residency program for a primary care
13	field of allopathic or osteopathic medicine that:
14	(1) is sponsored by or affiliated with a public
15	university in this state; and
16	(2) includes clinical training of resident physicians
17	<u>in:</u>
18	(A) a federally qualified health center, as
19	defined by 42 U.S.C. Section 1395x(aa)(4); and
20	(B) a hospital that:
21	(i) is located within 20 miles of the
22	international border with Mexico; and
23	(ii) serves patients residing in a rural
24	area, as defined by 42 U.S.C. Section 1395ww(d)(2)(D).

- 1 (a-2) In establishing the formula required by Subsection
- 2 <u>(a-1)</u>, the department:
- 3 (1) may not place a limit on the number of physician
- 4 residency training slots; and
- 5 (2) must recognize direct and indirect medical
- 6 expenditures of the residency program eligible for reimbursement
- 7 under the medical assistance program to the same extent those
- 8 direct and indirect medical expenditures are recognized under the
- 9 Medicare program.
- 10 (b) The department shall allocate the funds in the manner
- 11 the department determines most effectively and equitably achieves
- 12 the purposes for which those federal funds are received, consistent
- 13 with the needs of this state for graduate medical education and the
- 14 training of resident physicians in accredited residency programs in
- appropriate fields and specialties, taking into account other money
- 16 available to support graduate medical education. In determining
- 17 the needs of this state for graduate medical education, the
- 18 department shall give primary emphasis to graduate medical
- 19 education in primary care specialties and shall also give emphasis
- 20 to graduate medical education in a residency program described by
- 21 Subsection (a-1).
- 22 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 23 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 24 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 25 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 26 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 27 waiver or authorization is granted.

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1 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
