H.B. No. 2420

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the allocation of federal funds directed to be used to 3 support graduate medical education in connection with the state Medicaid program. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 32.0315, Human Resources Code, is amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (a-1) and 7 8 (a-2) to read as follows: (a-1) For purposes of allocating funds to a teaching 9 hospital under this section, the department shall establish a 10 separate formula for funds used to support the training of resident 11 12 physicians in an accredited residency program for a primary care 13 field of allopathic or osteopathic medicine that: 14 (1) is sponsored by or affiliated with a public university in this state; and 15 (2) includes clinical training of resident physicians 16 17 in: (A) a federally qualified health center, as 18 defined by 42 U.S.C. Section 1395x(aa)(4); and 19 (B) a hospital that: 20 21 (i) is located within 20 miles of the 22 international border with Mexico; and (ii) serves patients residing in a rural 23 area, as defined by 42 U.S.C. Section 1395ww(d)(2)(D). 24

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(a-2) In establishing the formula required by Subsection 1 (a-1), the department: 2 3 (1) may not place a limit on the number of physician 4 residency training slots; and 5 (2) must recognize direct and indirect medical 6 expenditures of the residency program eligible for reimbursement under the medical assistance program to the same extent those 7 8 direct and indirect medical expenditures are recognized under the 9 Medicare program. The department shall allocate the funds in the manner 10 (b) the department determines most effectively and equitably achieves 11 the purposes for which those federal funds are received, consistent 12 with the needs of this state for graduate medical education and the 13

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14 training of resident physicians in accredited residency programs in 15 appropriate fields and specialties, taking into account other money available to support graduate medical education. In determining 16 17 the needs of this state for graduate medical education, the department shall give primary emphasis to graduate medical 18 education in primary care specialties and shall also give emphasis 19 to graduate medical education in a residency program described by 20 21 Subsection (a-1).

SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the waiver or authorization is granted.

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1 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
