1 (d) Training provided by the department under this section 2 must be consistent with the governor's homeland security strategy 3 developed under Chapter 421, Government Code, and must educate 4 older persons about related programs and resources that are 5 available to provide additional assistance, such as family safety 6 plans, emergency management resources for persons with 7 disabilities, and bioterrorism disaster preparedness resources.

8 SECTION 2. Unless otherwise instructed by the office of the 9 governor, not later than January 1, 2006, the Department of Aging 10 and Disability Services shall:

(1) apply for federal funding available for homeland security training of older persons as required by Section 161.074, Human Resources Code, as added by this Act; and

14 (2) develop procedures to administer a homeland 15 security training program for older persons in accordance with that 16 section.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
