5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 101, Human Resources Code,
7	is amended by adding Section 101.035 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 101.035. HOMELAND SECURITY TRAINING PROGRAMS. (a)
9	After notifying the office of the governor in accordance with
10	Section 421.072(b), Government Code, the department, with the
11	assistance of the Department of Public Safety, shall apply for
12	federal funding available to provide homeland security training for
13	older adults.
14	(b) If the department receives a federal grant for homeland
15	security training of older adults, the department, with the
16	assistance of the Department of Public Safety, shall:
17	(1) establish and operate a program to provide older
18	adults with training on homeland security issues that affect their
19	safety and well-being; and
20	(2) seek the cooperation of area agencies on aging to
21	assist with the administration of the training.
22	(c) Training provided by the department under this section
23	must be consistent with the governor's homeland security strategy
24	developed under Chapter 421, Government Code, and must educate

1 <u>older adults about relevant programs and resources that are</u> 2 <u>available to provide additional assistance, such as family safety</u> 3 <u>plans, emergency management resources for persons with</u> 4 <u>disabilities, and bioterrorism disaster preparedness resources.</u>

5 SECTION 2. Unless otherwise instructed by the office of the 6 governor, not later than January 1, 2006, the Department of Aging 7 and Disability Services shall:

8 (1) apply for federal funding available for homeland
9 security training of older adults as required by Section 101.035,
10 Human Resources Code, as added by this Act; and

(2) develop procedures to administer a homeland security training program for older adults in accordance with that section.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
