1 AN ACT 2 relating to allowing the Texas Medical Disclosure Panel to hold 3 telephonic hearings. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 74.102(f), Civil Practice and Remedies 5 Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 (f) Meetings of the panel shall be held at the call of the 7 chairman or on petition of at least three members of the panel. 8 Notwithstanding Chapter 551, Government Code, or any other law, if 9 any member of the panel is physically present at a meeting, any 10 11 number of the other members of the panel may attend the meeting by 12 use of telephone conference call, videoconferencing, or other similar telecommunication method for purposes of establishing a 13 14 quorum or voting or for any other meeting purpose allowing a panel member to fully participate in any panel meeting. This subsection 15 applies without regard to the subject matter discussed or 16 considered by the panel at the meeting. A meeting held by telephone 17 18 conference call, videoconferencing, or other similar telecommunication method: 19 (1) is subject to the notice requirements applicable 20 21 to other meetings of the panel; 22 (2) may not be held unless the notice of the meeting 23 specifies the location of the meeting at which a member of the panel 24 will be physically present;

(3) must be open to the public and audible to the 1 2 public at the location specified in the notice under Subdivision (2); and 3 4 (4) must provide two-way audio communication between all panel members attending the meeting during the entire meeting, 5 6 and, if the two-way audio communication link with any member attending the meeting is disrupted at any time, the meeting may not 7 continue until the two-way audio communication link 8 is reestablished. 9

SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only to a meeting of the Texas Medical Disclosure Panel that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. A meeting of the panel that occurs before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before that date, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
