6 SECTION 1. Section 552.102, Government Code, is amended by

amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as

8 follows:

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- 9 (a) Information is excepted from the requirements of
- 10 Section 552.021 if it is information in a personnel file, the
- disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion
- 12 of personal privacy, or if it is information that is contained in a
- 13 standard periodic performance evaluation by a supervisor of an
- 14 employee of the governmental body. However, [except that] all
- information in the personnel file of an employee of a governmental
- 16 body is to be made available to that employee or the employee's
- 17 designated representative as public information is made available
- 18 under this chapter. The exception to public disclosure created by
- 19 this subsection is in addition to any exception created by Section
- 20 552.024. Public access to personnel information covered by Section
- 21 552.024 is denied to the extent provided by that section.
- 22 <u>(a-1)</u> Subsection (a) does not except from the requirements

- 24 (1) a standard performance evaluation of the chief

- 1 administrative officer of the governmental body or a department or
- 2 division head who reports directly to the chief administrative
- 3 <u>officer;</u>
- 4 (2) a reprimand, complaint, commendation, or other
- 5 <u>notation in the personnel records of a governmental employee that</u>
- 6 is not a part of a standard performance evaluation; or
- 7 (3) the standard performance evaluations of a class or
- 8 category of governmental employees, if the evaluations are redacted
- 9 so as not to identify individual employees.
- 10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
