1-7 AN ACT

1-8 relating to the office of district attorney for the 253rd Judicial  
1-9 District and to the creation of the office of district attorney for  
1-10 the 344th Judicial District.

1-11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-12 SECTION 1. Section 43.170, Government Code, is amended to  
1-13 read as follows:

1-14 Sec. 43.170. 253RD JUDICIAL DISTRICT. (a) The voters of  
1-15 Liberty County [~~the 253rd Judicial District~~] elect a district  
1-16 attorney for the 253rd Judicial District who represents the state  
1-17 in that district only in that county and in all cases before the  
1-18 75th District Court [~~, 253rd, and 344th district courts~~].

1-19 (b) The Commissioners Court [~~commissioners court~~] of  
1-20 Liberty County [~~one or more of the counties comprising the~~  
1-21 ~~district~~] may supplement the state salary of the district attorney.  
1-22 [~~The supplemental compensation may not exceed \$5,000 a year. The~~  
1-23 ~~Commissioners Court of Chambers County shall pay 40 percent of any~~  
1-24 ~~supplemental compensation, and the Commissioners Court of Liberty~~  
1-25 ~~County shall pay 60 percent. The supplemental compensation must be~~  
1-26 ~~paid from the officers' salary fund of the county. If the officers'~~  
1-27 ~~salary fund of a county is not adequate, the commissioners court may~~  
1-28 ~~transfer the necessary amount from the general fund of the county.]~~

1-29 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 43, Government Code, is  
1-30 amended by adding Section 43.1777 to read as follows:

1-31 Sec. 43.1777. 344TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT. (a) The voters of  
1-32 the 344th Judicial District elect a district attorney who  
1-33 represents the state in cases before the district courts of  
1-34 Chambers County.

1-35 (b) The Commissioners Court of Chambers County may  
1-36 supplement the state salary of the district attorney. The  
1-37 supplemental compensation may not exceed \$5,000 a year.

1-38 SECTION 3. Section 46.002, Government Code, is amended to  
1-39 read as follows:

1-40 Sec. 46.002. PROSECUTORS SUBJECT TO CHAPTER. This chapter  
1-41 applies to all county prosecutors and to the following state  
1-42 prosecutors:

1-43 (1) the district attorneys for the 1st, 2nd, 8th, 9th,  
1-44 12th, 18th, 21st, 23rd, 25th, 26th, 27th, 29th, 31st, 32nd, 33rd,  
1-45 34th, 35th, 36th, 38th, 42nd, 43rd, 47th, 49th, 50th, 51st, 52nd,  
1-46 53rd, 63rd, 64th, 66th, 69th, 70th, 76th, 81st, 83rd, 84th, 85th,  
1-47 88th, 90th, 97th, 100th, 105th, 106th, 110th, 118th, 119th, 123rd,  
1-48 142nd, 145th, 156th, 159th, 173rd, 196th, 198th, 216th, 220th,  
1-49 229th, 235th, 253rd, 258th, 259th, 266th, 268th, 271st, 278th,  
1-50 286th, 329th, 344th, 349th, and 355th judicial districts;

1-51 (2) the criminal district attorneys for the counties  
1-52 of Anderson, Austin, Bastrop, Bexar, Bowie, Brazoria, Caldwell,  
1-53 Calhoun, Cass, Collin, Comal, Dallas, Deaf Smith, Denton, Eastland,  
1-54 Galveston, Grayson, Gregg, Harrison, Hays, Hidalgo, Jasper,  
1-55 Jefferson, Kaufman, Lubbock, McLennan, Madison, Navarro, Newton,  
1-56 Panola, Polk, Randall, Rockwall, San Jacinto, Smith, Tarrant,  
1-57 Taylor, Tyler, Upshur, Van Zandt, Victoria, Walker, Waller,  
1-58 Wichita, Wood, and Yoakum; and

1-59 (3) the county attorneys performing the duties of  
1-60 district attorneys in the counties of Andrews, Callahan, Cameron,  
1-61 Castro, Colorado, Crosby, Ellis, Falls, Fannin, Freestone, Lamar,  
1-62 Lamb, Lampasas, Lee, Limestone, Marion, Milam, Morris, Ochiltree,  
1-63 Orange, Rains, Red River, Robertson, Rusk, Terry, Webb, and  
1-64 Willacy.
