## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the voluntary regulation of persons providing certain 3 ophthalmic goods and services.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 352.002, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subdivision (3-a) and amending Subdivisions (4) and (5) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (3-a) "Contact lens technician" means a person who
- 9 provides or offers to provide contact lens dispensing services or
- 10 products to the public.
- 11 (4) "Department" means the [Texas] Department of State
- 12 Health <u>Services</u>.
- 13 (5) "Dispensing optician" [or "ophthalmic dispenser"]
- 14 means a person who provides or offers to provide spectacle [ex-
- 15 contact lens] dispensing services or products to the public.
- SECTION 2. Section 352.101, Occupations Code, is amended by
- amending Subsections (a), (b), and (d) and adding Subsection (e) to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 (a) A person may not represent to the public that the person
- 20 is a "Registered Dispensing Optician" [or "Registered Spectacle
- 21 Dispenser"] unless the person is registered as a [spectacle]
- 22 dispensing optician and complies with this chapter.
- 23 (b) A person may not represent to the public that the person
- 24 is a ["Registered Contact Lens Dispenser" or] "Registered Contact

- 1 Lens Technician" unless the person is registered as a contact lens
- 2 technician [dispenser] and complies with this chapter.
- 3 (d) A person properly registered under this chapter may
- 4 represent to the public that the person is a "Registered Dispensing
- 5 Optician," ["Registered Spectacle Dispenser,"] "Registered Contact
- 6 Lens Technician," or "Registered Optician [Contact Lens
- 7 Dispenser]."
- 8 <u>(e) A person may not represent to the public that the person</u>
- 9 is a registered optician unless the person is registered as an
- optician and complies with this chapter.
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 352.102, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 352.102. ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATE; QUALIFICATIONS.
- 14 (a) The department shall issue a certificate of registration <u>as a</u>
- dispensing optician to an applicant who:
- 16 (1) applies and pays a registration fee;
- 17 (2) presents evidence satisfactory to the department
- 18 that the applicant has:
- 19 <u>(A) been actively engaged in spectacle</u>
- 20 dispensing, contact lens dispensing, or both for at least four
- 21 years;
- (B) has completed a four-year apprenticeship in
- 23 spectacle dispensing, contact lens dispensing, or both; or
- (C) has a degree relating to the field of
- ophthalmic optics and has engaged in spectacle dispensing, contact
- 26 lens dispensing, or both for at least two years [successfully
- 27 completed the number of classroom hours of training required by the

2	(3) passes the appropriate examination required under
3	Section 352.103.
4	(b) The <u>department</u> shall issue a certificate of
5	registration as a contact lens technician to an applicant who:
6	(1) applies and pays a registration fee;
7	(2) presents evidence satisfactory to the department
8	that the applicant:
9	(A) has been actively engaged in spectacle
10	dispensing, contact lens dispensing, or both for at least four
11	years;
12	(B) has completed a four-year apprenticeship in
13	spectacle dispensing, contact lens dispensing, or both; or
14	(C) has a degree relating to the field of
15	ophthalmic optics and has engaged in spectacle dispensing, contact
16	lens dispensing, or both for at least two years; and
17	(3) passes the appropriate examination required under
18	Section 352.103 [board may not require more than 30 classroom hours
19	of training as a prerequisite to registration].
20	(c) A person may qualify and be registered as:
21	(1) a dispensing optician;
22	(2) a contact lens technician;
23	(3) both a dispensing optician and a contact lens
24	technician; or
25	(4) an optician.
26	(d) The department shall issue a certificate of
27	registration as an optician to an applicant who:

(1) applies and pays a registration fee; 1 2 (2) presents evidence satisfactory to the department that the applicant has been actively engaged in spectacle 3 dispensing, contact lens dispensing, or both for at least six 4 5 years; 6 (3) is actively registered under this chapter as a 7 dispensing optician, a contact lens technician, or both; and (4) presents evidence satisfactory to the department 8 that the applicant has completed educational requirements 9 established by department rule that must: 10 (A) be provided by an entity approved by the 11 12 department; (B) include at least 100 hours of classroom 13 14 instruction; and 15 (C) be determined by the department to include 16 advanced training in ophthalmic optics. 17 (e) A person registered under this chapter as an optician must continue to be registered under this chapter as a dispensing 18 optician, a contact lens technician, or both a dispensing optician 19 and a contact lens technician [a spectacle dispenser, contact lens 20 21 dispenser, or both]. SECTION 4. Section 352.153(b), Occupations Code, is amended 22 to read as follows: 23

- 1 (2) 12 classroom hours of contact lens technician
- 2 continuing education courses each year for registration under
- 3 Section 352.102(b) as a contact lens technician; or
- 4 (3) 18 classroom hours of continuing education courses
- 5 each year for registration under this chapter as both a dispensing
- 6 optician and a contact lens technician, provided that half of the
- 7 hours are approved for dispensing optician continuing education and
- 8 half of the hours are approved for contact lens technician
- 9 continuing education.
- SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 11 a certificate of registration issued or renewed under Chapter 352,
- 12 Occupations Code, on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- issuance or renewal that occurs before the effective date of this
- 14 Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before that date,
- 15 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
