## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

Τ	AN ACT
2	relating to establishing a demonstration project for women's health
3	care services.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 32.0248 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 32.0248. DEMONSTRATION PROJECT FOR WOMEN'S HEALTH CARE
8	SERVICES. (a) The department shall establish a five-year
9	demonstration project through the medical assistance program to
10	expand access to preventive health and family planning services for
11	women. A woman eligible under Subsection (b) to participate in the
12	demonstration project may receive appropriate preventive health
13	and family planning services, including:
14	(1) medical history recording and evaluation;
15	(2) physical examinations;
16	(3) health screenings, including screening for:
17	(A) diabetes;
18	(B) cervical cancer;
19	(C) breast cancer;
20	(D) sexually transmitted diseases;
21	(E) hypertension;
22	(F) cholesterol; and
23	(G) tuberculosis;
24	(4) counseling and education on contraceptive

Τ	methods;
2	(5) provision of contraceptives;
3	(6) risk assessment; and
4	(7) referral of medical problems to appropriate
5	providers.
6	(b) A woman is eligible to participate in the demonstration
7	project if the woman is at least 18 years of age and:
8	(1) has a net family income that is at or below 185
9	percent of the federal poverty level;
10	(2) participates in or receives benefits under any of
11	the following:
12	(A) the medical assistance program;
13	(B) the financial assistance program under
14	<pre>Chapter 31;</pre>
15	(C) the nutritional assistance program under
16	<pre>Chapter 33;</pre>
17	(D) the Supplemental Food Program for Women,
18	Infants and Children; or
19	(E) another program administered by the state
20	that:
21	(i) requires documentation of income; and
22	(ii) restricts eligibility to persons with
23	income equal to or less than the income eligibility guidelines
24	applicable to the medical assistance program;
25	(3) is presumed eligible for one of the programs
26	listed in Subdivision (2) pending completion of that program's
27	eligibility process; or

- 1 (4) is a member of a family that contains at least one
- 2 person who participates in or receives benefits under one of the
- 3 programs listed in Subdivision (2).
- 4 (c) The department shall ensure that the standards of care
- 5 provided to a woman participating in the demonstration project are
- 6 consistent with the requirements of law and current best practices
- 7 <u>for provision of public health services.</u>
- 8 (d) The department shall develop procedures for determining
- 9 and certifying eligibility for services under the demonstration
- 10 project at the point of service delivery using integrated
- 11 procedures that minimize duplication of effort by providers, the
- department, and other state agencies. The department may not use a
- 13 procedure that would require a cost in excess of 10 percent of the
- 14 total costs of actual preventive health and family planning
- 15 services provided under the demonstration project. The eligibility
- 16 procedure may provide for expedited determination and
- 17 certification using a simplified form requiring only family income
- 18 and family size.
- 19 (e) The department shall compile a list of potential funding
- 20 sources a woman participating in the demonstration project may be
- 21 <u>able to use to help pay for treatment for health problems:</u>
- (1) identified using services provided under the
- 23 demonstration project; and
- 24 (2) for which the woman is not eligible to receive
- 25 treatment under the medical assistance program or the demonstration
- 26 project.
- 27 (f) Providers of services under the demonstration project

- 1 shall comply with requests made by the department for information
- 2 necessary for the department to:
- 3 (1) make efficient use of money spent for the
- 4 operation and administration of the demonstration project;
- 5 (2) report and provide information required by federal
- 6 law; and
- 7 (3) compile the report required by Subsection (g).
- 8 (g) Not later than December 1 of each even-numbered year,
- 9 the department shall submit a report to the legislature regarding
- 10 the department's progress in establishing and operating the
- 11 demonstration project.
- (h) The department shall ensure that money spent under the
- 13 demonstration project, regardless of the funding source, is not
- 14 used for an abortion, as defined by Section 245.002, Health and
- 15 Safety Code.
- (i) This section expires September 1, 2011.
- 17 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 18 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 19 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 20 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 21 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 22 waiver or authorization is granted.
- SECTION 3. Not later than September 1, 2006, the state
- 24 agency responsible for implementing the demonstration project
- 25 required by Section 32.0248, Human Resources Code, as added by this
- 26 Act, shall implement the demonstration project.
- 27 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
