1 for expunction of records and files under Article 55.01(b) may file
2 an ex parte petition for expunction in a district court for the
3 county in which:

(1) the petitioner was arrested; or

(2) the offense was alleged to have occurred.

6 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies to a 7 defendant seeking expunction of records relating to an arrest 8 regardless of whether the arrest occurred before, on, or after the 9 effective date of this Act.

10 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
