## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the assignment of certain visiting judges.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 74.054(a), Government Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (a) Except as provided by Subsections (b) and (c), the
- 7 following judges may be assigned as provided by this chapter by the
- 8 presiding judge of the administrative region in which the assigned
- 9 judge resides:
- 10 (1) an active district, constitutional county, or
- 11 statutory county court judge in this state;
- 12 (2) a senior judge who has consented to be subject to
- assignment and who is on the list maintained by the presiding judge
- 14 under this chapter;
- 15 (3) a former district or appellate judge, retired or
- 16 former statutory probate court judge, or retired or former
- 17 statutory county court judge who certifies to the presiding judge a
- 18 willingness to serve and who is on the list maintained by the
- 19 presiding judge as required by this chapter;
- 20 (4) a retiree or a former judge whose last judicial
- 21 office before retirement was justice or judge of the supreme court,
- 22 the court of criminal appeals, or a court of appeals and who has
- 23 been assigned by the chief justice to the administrative judicial
- 24 region in which the retiree or former judge resides for

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- 1 reassignment by the presiding judge of that region to a district or
- 2 statutory county court in the region; and
- 3 (5) an active judge or justice of the supreme court,
- 4 the court of criminal appeals, or a court of appeals [who has had
- 5 trial court experience].
- 6 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 7 74.054(a), Government Code, applies only to the assignment of a
- 8 judge or justice under Chapter 74, Government Code, made on or after
- 9 the effective date of this Act. An assignment made before the
- 10 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at the
- 11 time the assignment is made, and that law is continued in effect for
- 12 that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
